2. I am not in possession of any Texas law license.

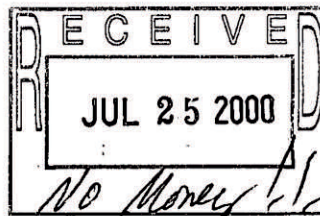
