PETITIONER'S ORIGINAL DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Comes now, Petitioner, COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas, complaining of Respondent, JOHN W. HENNESSEY, and in support thereof would respectfully show the Court the following:

Parties

Petitioner is the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent, JOHN W. HENNESSEY, Texas State Bar Number 09469000, is an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of Nueces County, Texas. Respondent may be served with citation and a copy of this petition by serving him at his principal place of business located at <u>638 Moray</u> Place, Corpus Christi, Texas 78411-6564.

Venue

Respondent's principal place of law practice is in Nueces County, Texas. Accordingly, pursuant to Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure 3.03, venue is proper in Nueces County, Texas.

I.

Pursuant to Tex.R.Civ.P. 190.1, Petitioner designates that discovery in this action should proceed pursuant to Level 2 (Tex.R.Civ.P. 190.3).

Professional Misconduct

II.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann., Sec. 81.001, <u>et seq.</u> (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of this action was filed by Clifford Ponton on or about April 4, 2000. The acts and conduct of Respondent, as hereinafter alleged, constitute professional misconduct.

III.

1. Respondent filed frivolous and non meritorious pleadings after the Judgment of the court had become final to the financial detriment of the Complainant by unreasonably increasing the cost of litigating the case.

2. Elva Gonzales was given a Notice of Foreclosure on property Complainant held a lien. Ms. Gonzales hired Respondent, who filed suit on her behalf against Complainant and others. Complainant's counsel filed a motion for summary judgment which was granted August 5, 1998. The judgment became final by operation of law on September 5, 1998.

3. Respondent filed Plaintiff's Motion in Arrest of Judgment; Judgment Interlocutory Not Final on October 4, 1998. On November 12, 1998, respondent files Plaintiff's Second Amended Original Petition adding Diane Larue as a new party to the original suit alleging she improperly held the trustee sale for the land foreclosed upon by Complainant. Respondent filed both actions after a final judgment had been entered and after he had knowledge of the court's action in disposing of his cause of action by final judgment on August 5, 1998.

IV.

The conduct of Respondent described above constitutes a violation of the following Texas

Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct:

Rule 3.01 -- A lawyer shall not bring or defend a proceeding, or assert or controvert an issue therein, unless the lawyer reasonably believes that there is a basis for doing so that is not frivolous.

Rule 3.02 -- In the course of litigation, a lawyer shall not take a position that unreasonably increases the costs or other burdens of the case or that unreasonably delays resolution of the matter.

<u>PRAYER</u>

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays that a judgment of professional misconduct be entered against Respondent imposing an appropriate sanction as the facts shall warrant and that Petitioner have such other and further relief to which it is entitled, including costs of court, restitution, and reasonable attorney fees.

Touche Ross Co.</u>, 946 S.W.2d 862 (Tex.App.- Houston [14th Dist.] 1997), which requires that all proceedings incident to a case occur in the county of proper venue. If not, I would respectfully request that an alternate appointment be made.

Once a trial judge has been appointed, please forward the original and three (3) copies of the Disciplinary Petition, the filing fee check, also enclosed herewith, and the Court's appointing order to the District Clerk of Nueces County, Texas, with the request that the suit be filed, service be obtained, and a filemarked copy of the petition returned to the undersigned.
