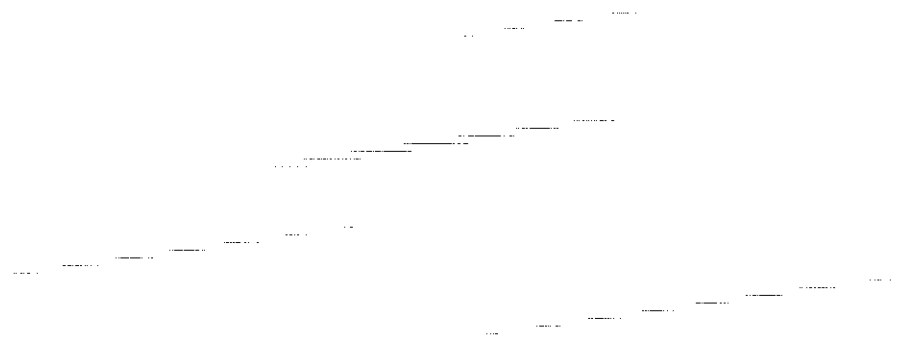

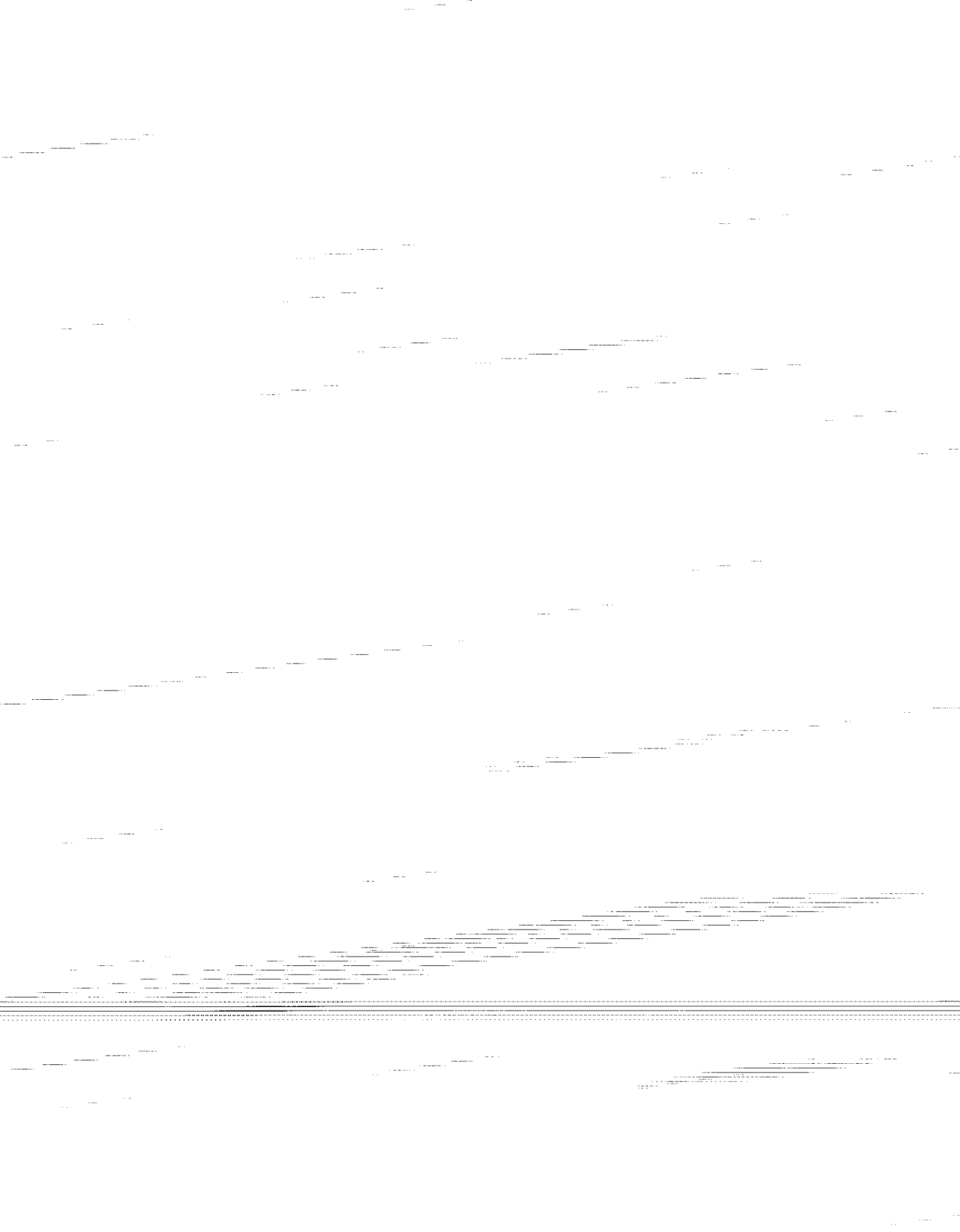

IV.

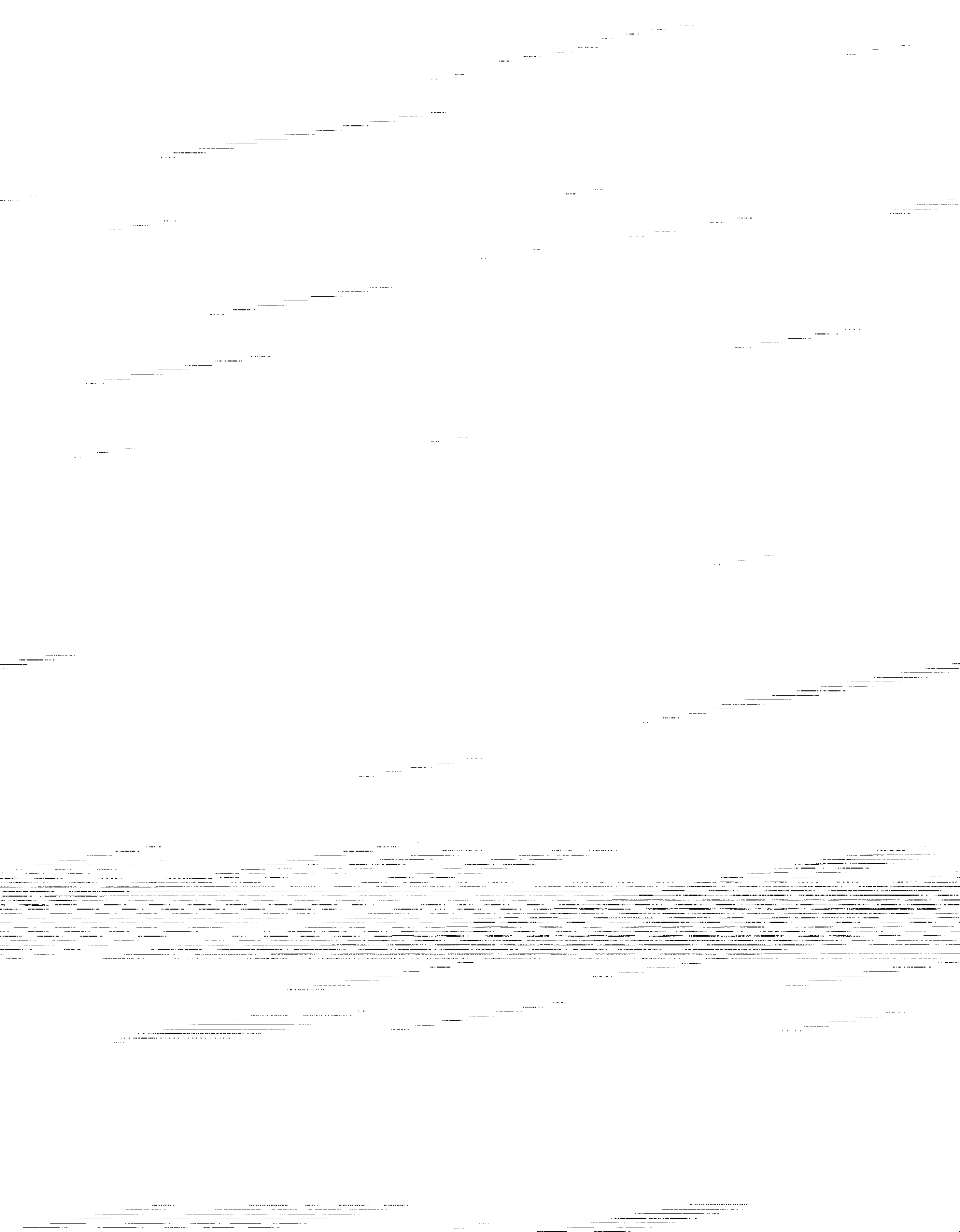
On or about July 30, 1998, Respondent began representing Nicholas Pelino ("Pelino") and his wife in criminal matters. During the course of the representation, specifically in July 2000, Pelino engaged in a business transaction pursuant to which Pelino provided Respondent's husband with a \$3,000.00 loan. Pelino was not provided a reasonable opportunity to seek the advice of independent legal counsel regarding the transaction and did not consent, in writing, to the transaction. Respondent's husband failed to timely repay the loan.

In August 2000, Respondent's husband gave Pelino a 1982 Mercedes Benz in lieu of money for the loan. Pelino subsequently received threatening telephone calls from Respondent demanding the return of the car. Pelino eventually returned the car although he had not been repaid the funds owed by Respondent's husband. In or around August 31, 2000, Pelino attempted to terminate the representation. However, after being informed of the situation, the Court directed Respondent to continue with the cases until such time as Pelino had the funds to retain new counsel. Respondent continued to represent Pelino and his wife, much to their dissatisfaction, until Pelino retained another attorney around January 31, 2001.

V.

On September 1, 2000, Respondent's license to practice law was suspended due to Respondent's failure to pay her State Bar dues. On September 17, 2001, Respondent wrote a lengthy letter to Pelino and his wife about the pending matters. The letter contained a detailed analysis of the pending matters and advice from Respondent regarding how to proceed with the matter. Respondent, therefore, practiced law at a time when her license to do so had been suspended.

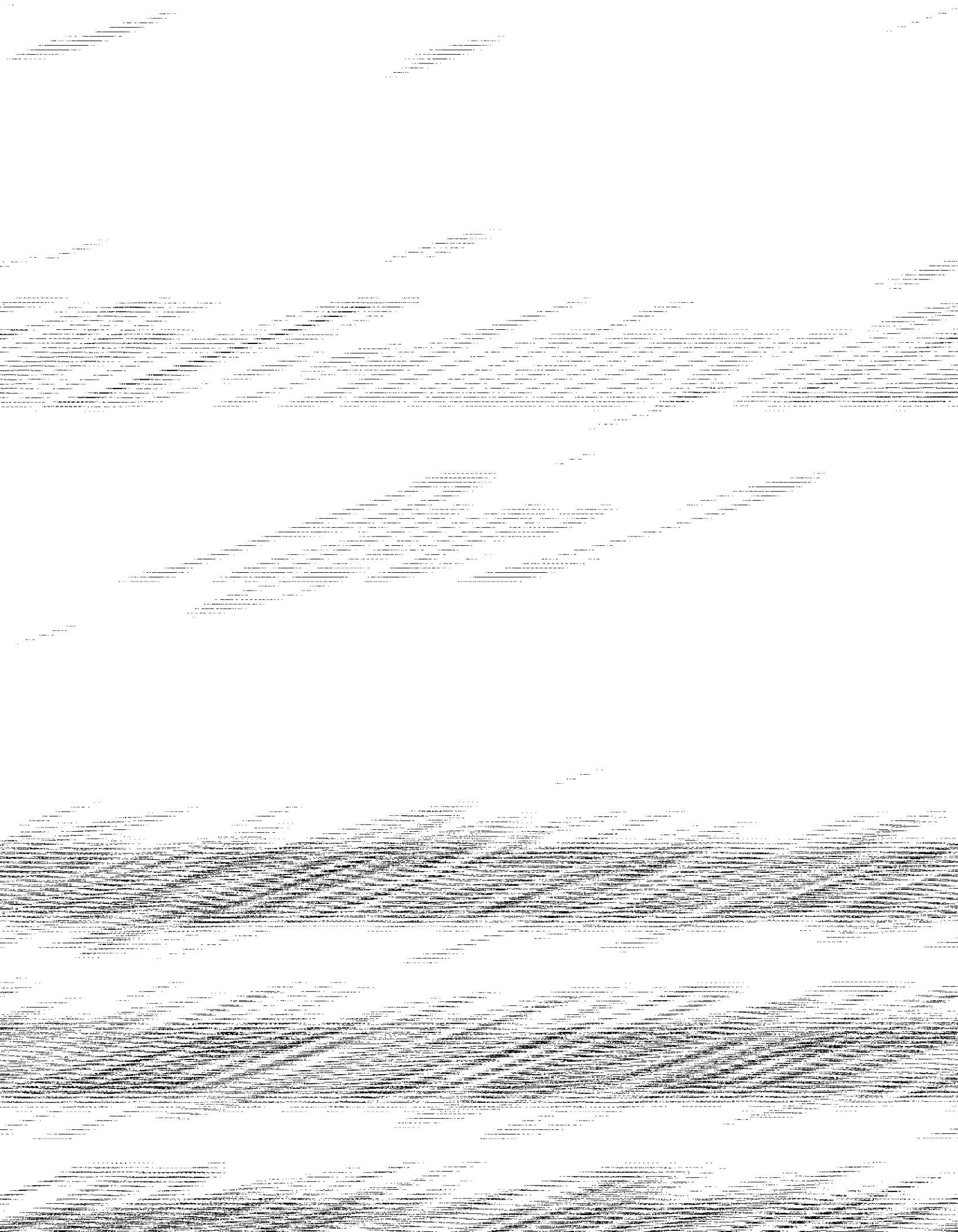
Dear Mr. Adams:
