ORDER

Dreitner, Jr heretofore issued by this court, be, and the same is hereby cancelled and revoked and his name be, and is hereby, removed and deleted from the list of persons licensed to practice law in the State of Texas. Receipt of permanent State Bar card issued by this Court to Victor F. Dreitner, Jr is hereby acknowledged. Victor F. Dreitner, Jr cannot locate his license.

TO THE HONORABLE SUPREME COURT OF TEXAS:

Pursuant to Part X of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure, James M. McCormack, Chief Disciplinary Counsel, hereby files this response on behalf of the State Bar of Texas, acting by and through the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, to the Motion for Acceptance of Resignation in Lieu of Discipline filed by Victor F. Dreitner, Jr, and would show as follows:

I.

The acceptance by the Court of the Resignation of Victor F. Dreitner, Jr. is in the best interest of the public and of the profession.

II.

(1) Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas.

(2) Respondent has knowingly failed to respond to lawful demands for information from a disciplinary authority.

(3) Respondent, upon receiving funds in which a third person had a interest, failed to notify the third person or take action to assure that the funds were disbursed to those persons entitled to receive them.

(4) Respondent has neglected legal matters entrusted to him.

(5) Respondent has failed to keep a client reasonably

informed about the status of a legal matter.

(6) Respondent has failed to promptly comply with reasonable requests for information from a client, when such information was necessary in order for the client to diligently prosecute a complaint against a former employer.

III.

WHEREFORE, the State Bar of Texas, moves the Court to accept the resignation in lieu of discipline and grant the motion filed by Movant.




Dear Mr. Adams:


