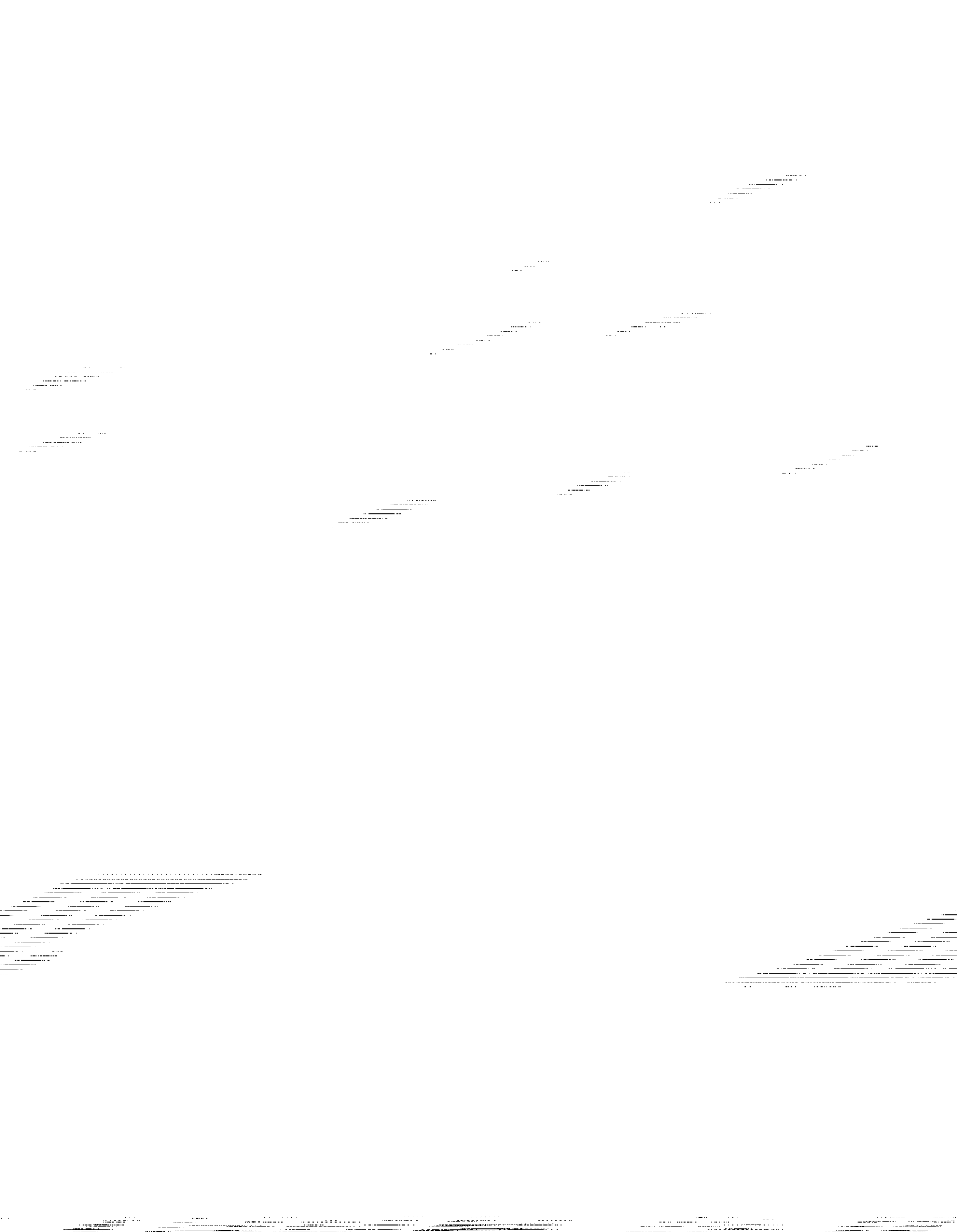
I.
