# **DISCIPLINARY PETITION**

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF THE COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent KENNETH T. WARD (hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, the Texas Government Code Annotated §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988 and supp. 1994), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaints that form the basis of this Disciplinary Petition were filed on or after May 1, 1992.

II.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of Harris County, Texas. Respondent's principal place of practice is Harris County, Texas, and therefore venue is appropriate in Harris County, Texas, pursuant to Rule 3.03 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at his business address located at 3300 S. Gessner, Suite 1500, Houston, Texas, 77063.

On or about October 27, 1988, Respondent was retained to represent Bernard Clark (hereafter referred to "Complainant") along with nine (9) family members who were defendants in a contested property division suit against other family members. Case was set for mediation but was delayed when one of the defendants died.

Once the deceased defendant's estate went through probate. Respondent proposed a settlement to the plaintiffs that was accepted. Due to the death of a second defendant, the agreed settlement was delayed until probate was completed. In or around April, 1992, probate was completed on death of second defendant and probate information was forwarded to Respondent.

Between 1992 and 1996, Respondent did not complete settlement of the property division he was retained to resolve. Between 1992 and 1996, Respondent has not kept the Complainant informed about the status of the case, nor responded to numerous phone calls and letters to his office by the Complainant.

#### IV.

The acts and/or omissions of the Respondent described in Paragraphs III above, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct in violation of Rule(s) 1.01(b)(1) [for neglecting a legal matter entrusted to the lawyer] of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

#### V.

The complaint that forms the basis of this cause of action was brought to the attention of the Office of the General Counsel by Bernard E. Clark's filing of this complaint on or about January 31, 1995.

#### **Prayer**

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE respectfully prays that this Court discipline Respondent, KENNETH T. WARD, by disbarment, suspension or reprimand as the facts shall warrant; and that the Petitioner have all other relief to which it may show itself to be justly entitled, including costs of court and attorney's fees.
