Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of practice in Harris County, Texas. An officer may serve citation on Respondent, by and through his attorney of record, Althea M. Bailey, 1 Houston Center, 1221 McKinney, Suite 1050, Houston, Texas 77010. Respondent, Donald Havlick's, license to practice law in the State of Texas was suspended on or about September 1, 1994 for non-payment of State Bar dues. Respondent's license to practice law was not reinstated until on or about July 9, 1996.

On or about April 24, 1996, while Respondent's license to practice law in the State of Texas was suspended, Respondent represented himself to be a lawyer when he filed or caused to be filed a Petition for Expunction of Records in Cause No. 96-020632, styled, <u>Ex Parte Ivon Lee, IV</u> in the 129th Judicial District Court of Harris County, Texas.

On or about February 22, 1996, while his license to practice law in the State of Texas was suspended, Respondent represented himself to be a lawyer when he filed or caused to be filed, Plaintiff's Original Petition in Cause No. 96-09940, styled <u>David Lavene v. Anheuser-Busch, Inc.</u>, in the 125th Judicial District Court of Harris County, Texas.

By filing the Petition for Expunction of Records in Cause No. 96-020632, styled, <u>Ex Parte Ivon Lee, IV</u> in the 129th Judicial District Court of Harris County, Texas, Respondent engaged in conduct in violation of Rules 8.04(a)(2)[a lawyer shall not commit a serious crime or commit any other criminal act that reflects adversely on the lawyer's honesty, trustworthiness or fitness as a lawyer in other respects]; 8.04(a)(11)[a lawyer shall not engage in the practice of law when the lawyer is on

inactive status or when the lawyer's right to practice has been suspended or terminated]; and 8.04(a)(12)[a lawyer shall not violate any other laws of this state relating to the professional conduct of lawyers and to the practice of law] of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and Rule 1.06(Q) of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.

By filing the Plaintiff's Original Petition in Cause No. 96-09940, styled <u>David</u> <u>Lavene v. Anheuser-Busch, Inc.</u>, in the 125th Judicial District Court of Harris County, Texas, Respondent engaged in conduct in violation of Rules **8.04(a)(2)**[a lawyer shall not commit a serious crime or commit any other criminal act that reflects adversely on the lawyer's honesty, trustworthiness or fitness as a lawyer in other respects]; **8.04(a)(11)**[a lawyer shall not engage in the practice of law when the lawyer is on inactive status or when the lawyer's right to practice has been suspended or terminated]; and **8.04(a)(12)**[a lawyer shall not violate any other laws of this state relating to the professional conduct of lawyers and to the practice of law] of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and Rule 1.06(Q) of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays for judgment that Respondent be disciplined by reprimand, suspension, or disbarment, as the facts shall warrant; and that Petitioner have such other and further relief to which entitled, including costs of Court and attorney's fees.
