DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF THE COURT:

The Commission for Lawyer Discipline ("Petitioner"), a permanent committee of the State Bar of Texas, complains of William B. Harrison ("Respondent"), an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Texas, showing the Court as follows:

1. NATURE OF PROCEEDING

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, the Texas Government Code Annotated §81.001, *et seq.* (Vernon 1988 and supp. 1994), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint that forms the basis of this disciplinary petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

2. VENUE

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of Nueces County, Texas. Respondent's principal place of practice is in Nueces County, Texas. Therefore venue is appropriate in Nueces County, Texas, pursuant to Rule 3.03 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.

3. ISSUANCE OF CITATION AND SERVICE OF PROCESS REQUESTED

Petitioner requests that citation be issued and forwarded to the Sheriff of Nueces County so that service of process can be made upon Respondent. A Deputy Sheriff may serve Respondent at his business address at 814 Leopard Street, Corpus Christi, Texas 78401.

4. FACTS GIVING RISE TO PROCEEDING

- 4.01 On or about September 15, 1993, Gerardo Rivera ("Complainant") was injured in a work related accident. Sometime after that, Complainant retained Respondent's firm to represent him in his worker's compensation claim resulting from the accident. Buddy Bell ("Bell"), an associate employed by Respondent's firm was assigned to prosecute Complainant's worker's compensation claim.
- 4.02 On or about May 5, 1995, Complainant's worker's compensation claim was set for mediation. Complainant's wife, Complainant and Bell attended the mediation. During the mediation numerous offers and counter offers were made by the parties to the mediation. During the negotiations Complainant asked Bell if settling his claim would compromise his receipt of medical services. Bell told Complainant that settling his claim would not affect his receipt of medical care. Based upon this information Complainant agreed to settle his claim for \$48,000.00.
- 4.03 On or about March 1, 1996, Complaint received notice that he would no longer be provided with medical care by his worker's

compensation insurance. Alarmed by the sudden change of events,

Complainant called Respondent's office to speak with Bell. However,

Complainant was informed that Bell no longer worked for Respondent's

firm. After being informed that Bell no longer worked for Respondent's

firm, Complainant discussed his concerns with Respondent. Respondent

told Complainant that Bell would never have told him that Complainant's

worker's compensation insurance would cover Complainant's medical bills

after he settled his case. In addition, Respondent told Complainant that

this was his problem and he had to resolve it himself.

- 4.04 Complainant filed a grievance with the State Bar of Texas, against Respondent, on or about April 29, 1996. On or about May 29, 1996, Respondent was sent a copy of the grievance filed against him and a letter notifying him that a grievance was filed against him. On or about May 31, 1996, Respondent received a copy of the grievance filed against him and the letter notifying him of the grievance.
- 4.05 Respondent failed to respond to the grievance as required by the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.
- 5. SPECIFIC VIOLATIONS OF THE TEXAS DISCIPLINARY RULES OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

The acts and/or omissions of the Respondent described in Section 4 above, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct in violation of Rule 8.04(a)(8) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional

Conduct.

6. TIMELINESS OF FILING

The complaint that forms the basis of this cause of action was brought to the attention of the Office of the General Counsel by Gerardo Rivera's filing this complaint on or about April 26, 1996.

7. PRAYER

Petitioner prays that this Court discipline Respondent by disbarment, suspension or reprimand, as the facts shall warrant; and that the Petitioner have all other relief to which it may show itself to be justly entitled, including costs of court and attorneys' fees.
