#### **DISCIPLINARY PETITION**

#### TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF THE COURT:

The COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE ("Petitioner") a permanent committee of the State Bar of Texas, pursuant to the authority of an investigatory panel for State Bar District Number 4E files this Disciplinary Petition complaining of Joseph Onwuteaka ("Respondent"), an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Texas, showing the Court as follows:

### 1. NATURE OF PROCEEDING

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, the Texas Government Code Annotated §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988 and supp. 1994), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaints that form the basis of this Disciplinary Petition were filed on or after May 1, 1992.

#### 2. VENUE

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of Harris County, Texas.

Respondent's principal place of practice is Harris County, Texas. Therefore, venue is

appropriate in Harris County, Texas, pursuant to Rule 3.03 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.

## 3. ISSUANCE OF CITATION REQUESTED

- 3.01 Petitioner requests that citation be issued and forwarded to: Jeannette Duer,

- 3.02 Respondent may also be served at his business address located at 7324 Southwest Freeway, Suite 310, Houston, Texas, 77074.

### 4. BROWN'S COMPLAINT

PURSUANT TO PART III OF THE TEXAS RULES OF DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE, PETITIONER REQUESTS THIS COURT TO DISCIPLINE ONWUTEAKA FOR ACTS OF PROFESSIONAL MISCONDUCT.

- 4.01 ONWUTEAKA ENGAGED IN CONDUCT VIOLATING TEXAS DISCIPLINARY RULE OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT 1.15(d) [Upon termination of representation, a lawyer shall take steps to the extent reasonably practicable to protect a client's interests, such as surrendering papers and property to which the client is entitled].
  - (A) On or about August 9. 1995, Cynthia Brown ("Brown"), retained Respondent for divorce proceedings.
  - (B) Upon termination of Respondent's representation, Brown requested a copy of her client file.
  - (C) Respondent failed to protect Brown's interest when he refused to provide a copy of the client file to either Brown or her new attorney.
- 4.02 ONWUTEAKA ENGAGED IN CONDUCT VIOLATING TEXAS DISCIPLINARY RULES OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT 1.14(b) [for failing, upon receiving funds or other property in which a client has an interest, to render a full accounting upon request].

- (A) Upon termination of representation, Brown requested an accounting of funds paid to Respondent.
- (B) Respondent failed to render such an accounting when requested.

# 4.03 ONWUTEAKA ENGAGED IN CONDUCT VIOLATING TEXAS DISCIPLINARY RULE OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT 8.04(a)(1) [A lawyer shall not violated these rules, knowingly assist or induce another to do so whether or not such violation occurred in the course of a client-lawyer relationship].

- (A) Respondent failed to surrender the client file upon Brown's proper request.
- (B) Respondent failed to give an accounting of funds to Brown upon proper request.
- (C) Respondent has violated the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

#### 6.0 PRAYER

Petitioner respectfully prays that this Court discipline Respondent b disbarment, suspension or reprimand, as the facts shall warrant; and that the Petitioner have all other relief to which it may show itself to be justly entitled including costs of court and attorneys' fees.
