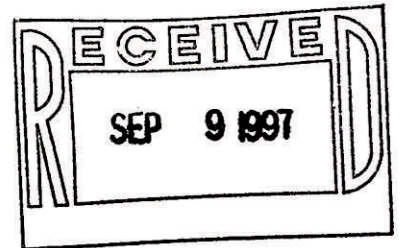

On June 12, 1997, after I received the annual Membership Fee Statement from the State Bar of Texas, I wrote to confirm my intention to resign from the State Bar of Texas. I have enclosed a copy of that letter. I now see that I may have addressed that letter to the wrong office. Please accept this letter as notice of my resignation from the State Bar of Texas, effective June 1, 1997.
