PETITIONER'S ORIGINAL DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF THE COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, ROBERT D. CLEMENTS, JR. (hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

Nature of Proceeding

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, the Texas Government Code Annotated §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988 and supp. 1994), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint that forms the basis of this Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

II. Venue

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent's principal place of practice is Galveston County, Texas, and therefore venue is appropriate in Galveston County, Texas, pursuant to Rule 3.03 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at his business address located at First National Bank Building, 1600 E. Highway 6, Suite 318, Alvin, Texas

III. Cause of Action

Bruce K. Watkins (hereinafter called "Watkins") represented the defendant in a civil matter filed by Respondent. The parties negotiated a settlement. On or about April 13, 1995, Watkins forwarded a check in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) to Respondent. The check was conditionally tendered to Respondent, with the express instructions that Respondent was to hold the funds in escrow and not deliver the funds to Respondent's clients or to permit the check to be negotiated until Respondent returned the executed settlement agreement to Watkins. Respondent's clients did not accept the terms of the settlement agreement, and Respondent failed to deposit the check into a separate account until the matter could be resolved. Respondent delivered the check to his clients and permitted them to negotiate it. On or about November 1, 1995, Watkins demanded the return of the check. On or about November 7, 1995, Respondent refused to return the check.

IV.

The acts and/or omissions of the Respondent described in Paragraph III above, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct in violation of rule 1.14(c) [all funds in a trust or escrow account shall be disbursed only to those persons entitled to receive them by virtue of the representation or by law] of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

The complaint that forms the basis of this cause of action was brought to the attention of the Office of the General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Bruce K. Watkins' filing of a complaint on or about August 28, 1996.

Prayer

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner, the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, respectfully prays that this Court discipline Respondent, ROBERT D. CLEMENTS, JR., by reprimand, suspension or disbarment, as the facts shall warrant; and that the Petitioner have all other relief to which it may show itself to be justly entitled, including costs of court and attorneys' fees.
