COMES NOW Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State Bar of Texas, complaining of Respondent, Leonard B. DeRosa, showing the Court:

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex.Gov't Code Ann. §81.001, <u>et seq.</u> (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed with the State Bar of Texas on or after May 1, 1992.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of practice in Harris County, Texas. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at his business address located at 11191 Westheimer Blvd., Suite 560, Houston, Harris County, Texas 77042. On or about September 25, 1996, Respondent filed, "Plaintiff Richard McKenzle's First Set of Requests for Production of Documents" in Cause No. 658875, styled <u>Richard McKenzie and Franklin Ivey v. Tan Van Nyguen</u>, in the County Court at Law Number Four (4) of Harris County, Texas. Respondent filed this document as attorney for Plaintiff, Richard McKenzie.

At the time Respondent filed this document, Respondent's license to practice law in the State of Texas had been suspended for failure to pay the yearly attorney occupational tax. Respondent's license was suspended from April 1996 through April 1997,

By filing the document in court as attorney for the plaintiff, Respondent engaged in conduct in violation of Rules 8.04(a)(1)[a lawyer shall not violate the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct]; and 8.04(a)(11)[a lawyer shall not engage in the practice of law when the lawyer is on inactive status or when the lawyer's right to practice has been suspended or terminated, including but not limited to situations where a lawyer's right to practice has been administratively suspended for failure to timely pay required fees or assessments or for failure to comply with Article XII of the State Bar Rules relating to Mandatory Continuing Legal Education] of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, and of Rule 1.06(Q) of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.

The complaint which forms the basis of this lawsuit as hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of the General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by the filing of a complaint by William Torok on or about November 8, 1996.

<u>PRAYER</u>

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays for judgment that Respondent, Leonard De Rosa, be disciplined by reprimand, suspension, or disbarment, as the facts shall warrant; and that Petitioner have such other and further relief to which entitled, including costs of Court and Attorney's fees.
