## **DISCIPLINARY PETITION**

## TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Comes now, Petitioner, COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, complaining of Respondent, REGINA M. SCRIVNER-TIBBS, and in support thereof would respectively show the Court the following:

#### **Parties**

Petitioner is the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent, REGINA M. SCRIVNER-TIBBS, State Bar No. 17931200, is an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of Bexar County, Texas, and her usual place of employment is 16239 Deer Crest, San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas 78248. No service is required.

#### <u>Venue</u>

Respondent's principal place of law practice is in Bexar County, Texas. Accordingly, pursuant to Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure 3.03, venue is proper in Bexar County, Texas.

#### **Professional Misconduct**

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann., Sec. 81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988), the <u>Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct</u> and the <u>Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure</u>. The complaint which forms the basis of this action was filed on or about June 2, 1997 by Hipolito Fabela. The acts and conduct of Respondent, as hereinafter alleged, constitute professional misconduct.

#### Π.

On or about January 7, 1997, Mr. Hipolito Fabela hired Respondent for representation in matters related to a December 13, 1996 auto accident in which Mr. Fabela's wife, Cynthia Carrisal Fabela, was killed. Respondent received a fee of \$51,000, which included a \$16,000 initial lump sum plus a 33 1/3% contingency fee on a \$104,000 insurance claim. Respondent failed to clearly communicate the basis or rate of her fee to Mr. Fabela. Respondent did not enter into a written contingent fee agreement with Mr. Fabela at the inception of the attorney-client relationship.

#### Ш.

Respondent failed to provide Mr. Fabela with a settlement statement of insurance funds received and a statement of the fees to be charged for services rendered by Respondent.

#### IV.

During the course of representation, Respondent failed to keep Mr. Fabela adequately informed about the status of his claims or failed to respond to some of Mr. Fabela's requests for information.

The conduct of Respondent described above constitutes violations of Texas Disciplinary

Rules of Professional Conduct as follows:

**Rule 1.03(b)** -- A lawyer shall explain a matter to the extent reasonable necessary to permit the client to make informed decisions regarding the representation.

**Rule 1.04(c)** -- When the lawyer has not regularly represented the client, the basis or rate of the fee shall be communicated to the client, preferably in writing, before or within a reasonable time after commencing the representation.

**Rule 1.04(d)** -- A contingent fee shall be in writing and shall state the method by which the fee is to be determined.

#### **Praver**

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays that a judgment of professional misconduct be entered against Respondent, REGINA M. SCRIVNER-TIBBS, and that Petitioner have such other relief to which it is entitled, including costs of court and attorney's fees.
