The COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE ("Petitioner") a permanent committee of the State Bar of Texas, pursuant to the authority of an investigatory panel for State Bar District Number 4E files this Disciplinary Petition complaining of SAMUEL O. EIIOGU ("Respondent"), an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Texas, showing the Court as follows:

1. NATURE OF PROCEEDING

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, the Texas Government Code Annotated §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988 and supp. 1994), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaints that form the basis of this Disciplinary Petition were filed on or after July 19, 1996.

2. VENUE

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of Harris County, Texas.

Respondent's principal place of practice is Harris County, Texas. Therefore, venue is

appropriate in Harris County, Texas, pursuant to Rule 3.03 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.

3. ISSUANCE OF CITATION REQUESTED

- 3.01 Petitioner requests that citation be issued and forwarded to: Jeannette Duer,1111 Fannin, Suite 1370, Houston, Texas 77002, for service by an individual processor.
- 3.02 Respondent may also be served through his attorney of record, James O. Okorafor, at his business address located at 8303 S.W. Frwy, Suite 320, Houston, Harris County, Texas, 77074.
- 4. PURSUANT TO PART III OF THE TEXAS RULES OF DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE, PETITIONER REQUESTS THIS COURT TO DISCIPLINE EJIOGU FOR THE ACTS OF PROFESSIONAL MISCONDUCT
 - 4.01 EJIOGU ENGAGED IN CONDUCT VIOLATING TEXAS DISCIPLINARY RULE OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT 1.14 (a).
 - (A) Respondent represented Maria Dubon ("Dubon") who was involved in an automobile accident.
 - (B) Dubon was treated for the injuries at the North Shepherd

 Medical Group from December 7, 1994 through February 21,

 1995.
 - (C) Dubon instructed the Respondent to pay all medical bills from any settlement received.

(D) Respondent failed to maintain his accounting records

reflecting receipt of the settlement, notification of parties

having an interest and disbursement of the settlement fund

to all parties having an interest in the settlement.

4.02 EJIOGU ENGAGED IN CONDUCT VIOLATING TEXAS DISCIPLINARY RULE OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT 1.14.(b).

- (A) Complainant was not contacted upon Respondent's receipt of funds on behalf of Dubon.
- (B) Complainant filed a grievance with the State Bar of Texas on June 28, 1996.
- (C) Respondent made restitution to the Complainant after the grievance was filed.

5.0 PRAYER

Petitioner respectfully prays that this Court discipline Respondent by disbarment, suspension or reprimand, as the facts shall warrant; and that the Petitioner have all other relief to which it may show itself to be justly entitled including costs of court and attorneys' fees.
