





The number of new **misdemeanors cases punishable by fine only** continued to decline. Filings **fell** by **5%** overall from the previous year.




The number of Class C cases involving **juveniles or minors declined** by **36%** overall from the previous year and by 60% over the last 5 years.




The number of new **Class A and B Misdemeanors** continued to decline. Filings **fell** by **4%** overall from the previous year.







The number of new **Felony** cases continued to increase slightly. Filings **increased** by **2%** overall from the previous year.




The number of new **family** case filings **increased** by **8**% overall from the previous year.




The number of new **civil** case filings continued to increase slightly in district and county courts. Filings **increased** by **3**% overall from the previous year.



The number of new **probate and guardianship** filings **decreased** by **1**% overall from the previous year. While filings of new guardianship cases decreased, total filings in those cases increased slightly, as did the number of active guardianships reported.








The number of new **applications for involuntary mental health commitments increased** by **5**% overall from the previous year.









The number of new **criminal** cases filed in the 14 **Courts of Appeals declined** by **4%** from the previous year, but **civil** cases **increased** by **1**%. The average time from filing to disposition for **civil** cases was the **lowest since 1989**, and the time to disposition for **criminal** cases **decreased** for the third year.



In the **Court of Criminal Appeals**, filings **declined** slightly in all categories.



The number of **opinions** delivered **increased** by **64%** and was the highest number since 2000.



In the **Supreme Court**, filings of petitions for review and other petitions and writs **declined**, but **regular causes** added to the court's docket **increased** by **10%** from the previous year.

Case processing times fell to the **lowest** levels since data collection began in 2005.
