border. The TIDC Board met on December 3 to discuss <u>this agenda</u>. On March 2, the TIDC Grants and Reporting Committee met to discuss Improvement grant applications and modifications. On March 10, the <u>Full Board</u> met for updates from the Improvement, Policy, and Funding teams at TIDC. The next board meeting is on June 9 at 1:00 p.m. in the 1st floor conference room in the Tom C. Clark building.

TIDC at the Texas Legislature

Geoff Burkhart testified about Operation Lone Star in the House Corrections Committee on September 27 and at the House Criminal Jurisprudence Committee Hearing on October 4. He also served as a resource witness at the House Appropriations Committee Hearing as they



considered distribution of federal funding on October 6 and On October 12, he served as a resource witness at a House Appropriations Committee meeting. On April 5, **Geoff Burkhart** testified at the <u>Senate Committee on Border Security</u> <u>hearing with Megan LaVoie</u>.

The 87th Texas Legislature adjourned sine

die in October. During the final special session, the Legislature allocated federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds. TIDC requested (1) \$63 million to help address the statewide COVID-related backlog (approximately 142,000 criminal cases); and (2) \$14 million to help replace lost general revenue-dedicated (GR-D) to the Fair Defense Account. Although the Legislature did not appropriate \$63 million for the backlog, <u>SB 8</u> does include nearly \$14 million to address TIDC's COVID-related revenue shortfalls.

Staff Update

In addition to its normal monitoring, grants administration, and data collection, TIDC staff has been involved in the following:

- Nicolas Sawyer, Bill Cox, Linda Gonzalez, Crystal Leff-Piñon, Olivia Lee, and Kristin Meeks joined the TIDC staff. Matthew Fischer interned with TIDC this spring.
- TIDC staff has traveled to Parker, Zavala, Maverick, Bosque, Comanche, Archer, Clay, Wilbarger, Galveston, San Saba, and Mason Counties for fiscal and policy monitoring visits.
- TIDC staff has issued final fiscal monitoring reports for <u>Dallas</u>, <u>Bastrop</u> and <u>Medina</u> Counties.
- TIDC staff has presented at several conferences and workshops including the <u>TAC Legislative Conference</u>, the <u>NAPD 2021 Women's</u> <u>Conference</u>, the <u>Texas</u> <u>Association of County</u>



<u>Auditors Conference</u>, the Texas Association of Counties Judicial Education Conference, a Juvenile Training Immersion Program (JTIP) training on Effective Detention Hearing Advocacy, the University of Texas School of Law Children's Rights Clinic, the Texas Association of Counties' Spring Judicial Education Session in Lubbock on "Indigent Defense and Mental Health Issues," and the <u>National Association for Public Defense's</u> <u>2nd National Public Defense Virtual Conference</u>.

Institute in November. NAPD serves nearly 30,000 members nationwide.
