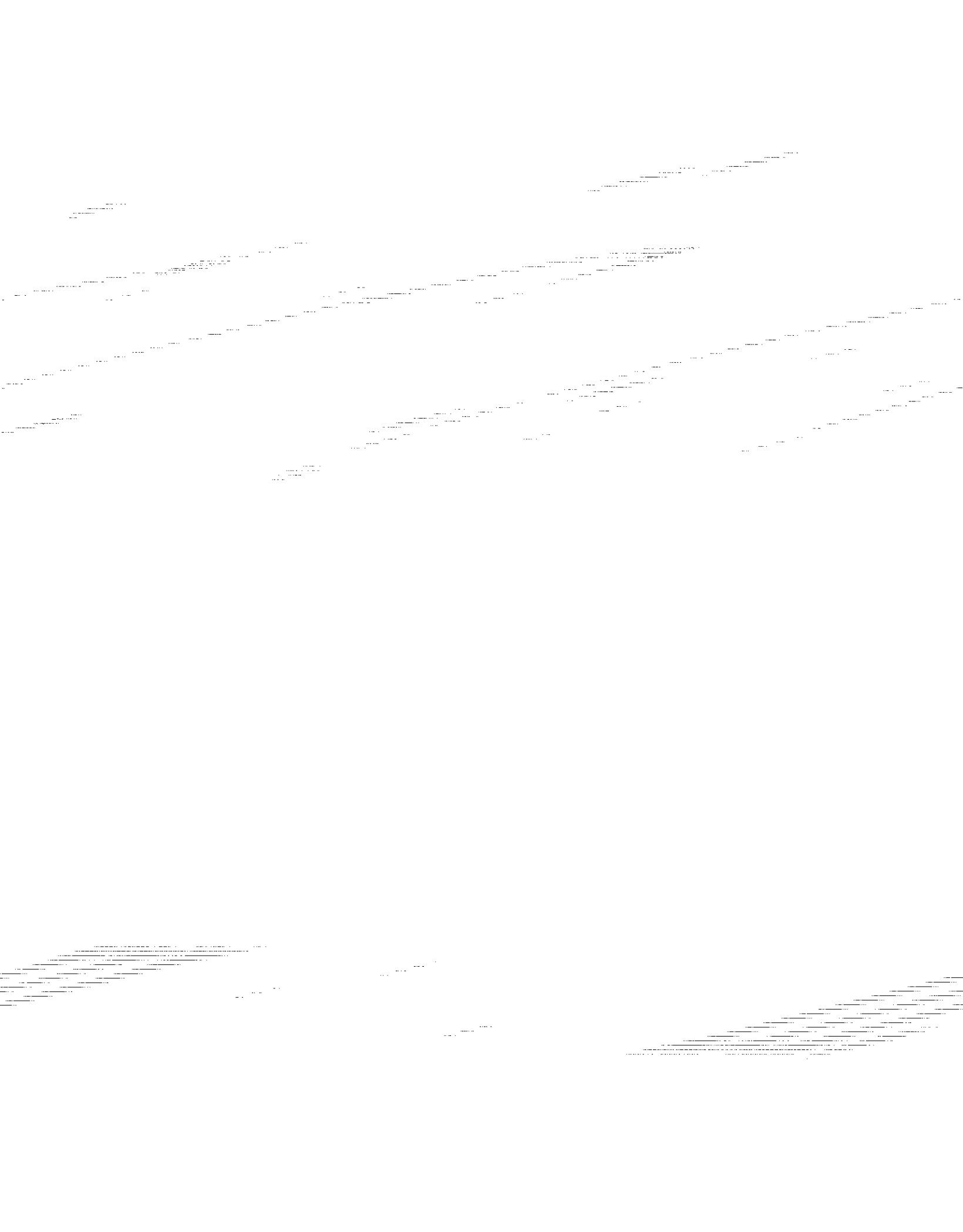

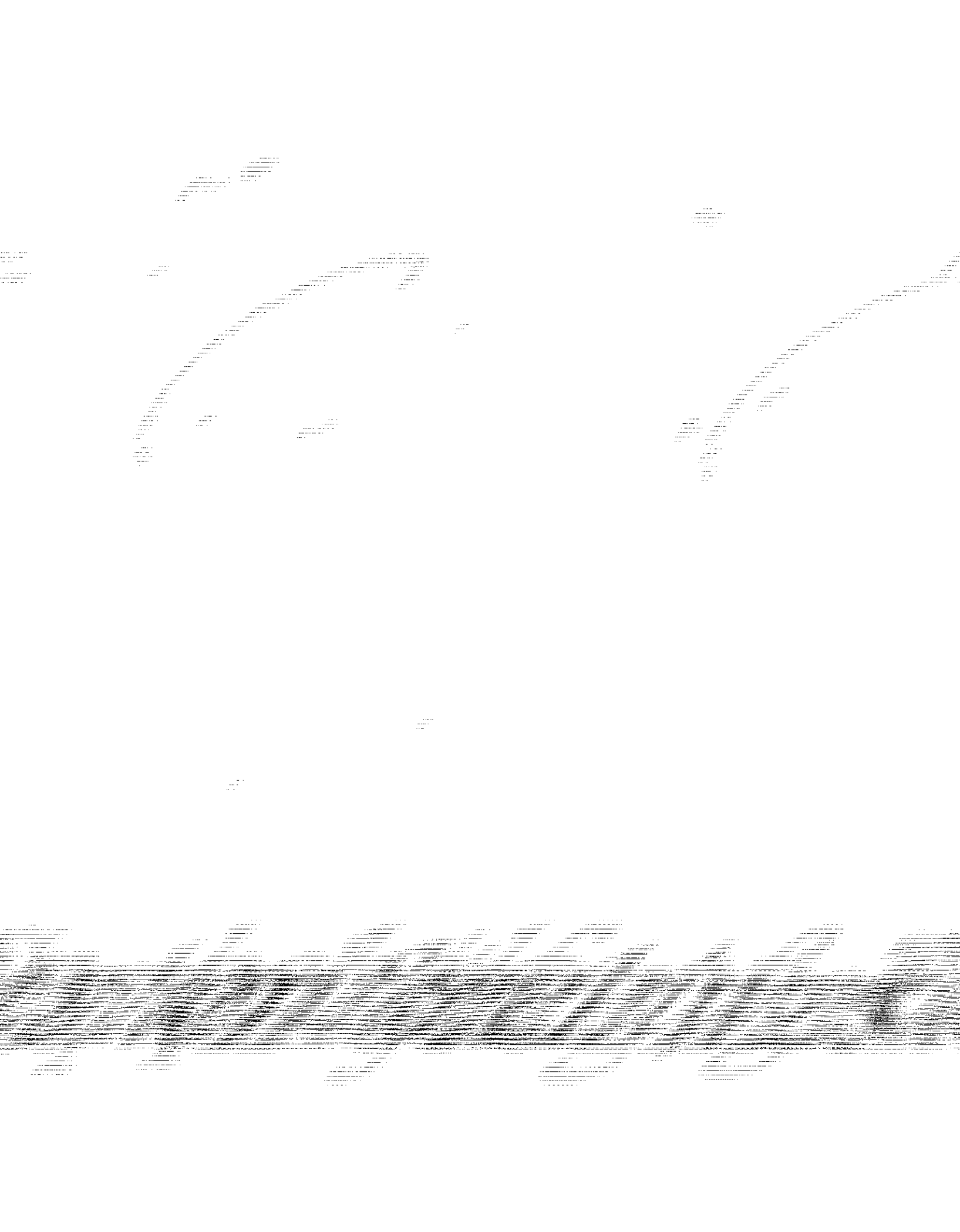
I.
