### **DISCIPLINARY PETITION**

#### TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Comes now, Petitioner, COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas, complaining of Respondent, DAN T. SORRELLS, State Bar No. 18855000 and in support thereof would respectfully show the Court the following:

#### **Parties**

Petitioner is the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent, DAN T. SORRELLS, is an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of Hays. Co unty and may be served at his place of business at 17 Cotton Gin Road, Uhland, Texas 78640.

#### Venue

Respondent's principal place of law practice is in Hays County, Texas. Accordingly, pursuant to Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure 3.03, venue is proper in Hays County, Texas.

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann., Sec. 81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which form the basis of this action was filed on or about December 31, 1996. The acts and conduct of Respondent, as hereinafter alleged,

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. On or about October 1994 the Respondent hired a non-lawyer, Dedra Wood as office manager for the Respondent's Abilene office. Thereafter, the Respondent established an operating and an IOLTA account in that office. On July 27, 1995, Richard Ramirez, the Complainant, signed an "Agreement For Legal Service" and hired Dan T. Sorrels, Attorney, and Dedra Wood, Legal Assistant, for representation in a Social Security claim. The Agreement called for the payment for legal services not to exceed the lesser of 25% of the past-due benefits or \$4000. The Social Security case was processed from beginning to end by Dedra Wood without any supervision from the Respondent. Upon the resolution of the claim, the Social Security Administration paid, by separate check, \$2635 in attorney fees to the Respondent. This amount represented 25% of the past-due benefits paid to Ramirez. In addition, on or about November 8, 1995, in reference to the same Social Security claim, \$1976.25 was wrongfully withheld from Ramirez' share of his past-due benefits by Dedra Wood. The \$1976.25, withheld as attorney fees, was never returned to Ramirez.

III.

The conduct of Respondent described above constitutes a violation of Texas Disciplinary Rule of Professional Conduct 5.03(a)(b)(1), to wit:

RULE 5.03(a)(b)(1) — With respect to a non-lawyer employed or retained by or associated with a lawyer: (a) a lawyer having direct supervisory authority over the non-lawyer shall make reasonable efforts to ensure that the person's conduct is compatible with the professional obligations of the lawyer; and (b) a lawyer shall be subject to discipline for the conduct of such a person that would be a violation of these rules if engaged in by the lawyer if: (1) the lawyer orders, encourages, or permits the conduct involved;....

#### **Prayer**

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays that a judgment of professional misconduct be entered against Respondent imposing an appropriate sanction as the facts shall warrant and that Petitioner have such other relief to which it is entitled, including costs of court and attorney's fees.

Dear Judge Pennington:
