


4. PHILLIPS COMPLAINT

PURSUANT TO PART III OF THE TEXAS RULES OF DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE, PETITIONER REQUEST THIS COURT TO DISCIPLINE HOMMINGA FOR ACTS OF PROFESSIONAL MISCONDUCT.

4.01 HOMMINGA ENGAGED IN CONDUCT VIOLATING TEXAS DISCIPLINARY RULE OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

- 1.01(b)(1) [in representing a client, a lawyer shall not neglect a legal matter entrusted to the lawyer];
- 8.01(b) [fail to correct a misapprehension known by the person to have arisen in the matter, or knowingly fail to respond to a lawful demand for information from an admission, reinstatement, or disclosure on information otherwise protected by Rule 1.05];
- 8.04(a)(8) [fail to timely furnish to the Chief Disciplinary Counsel's office or a district grievance committee a response or other information as required by the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure, unless or other legal ground for failure to do so].
- A. On or about October 28, 1996, Billy Phillips ("Phillips"), retained Respondent to represent him in an appeal pertaining to a Bill of Review for his pension.
- B. Phillips paid Respondent \$1,000.00 for her professional services.
- C. Respondent neglected Phillips's legal matter, by closing Respondent's law office and leaving Phillips's file and papers in the office hallway, and failing to communicate with Phillips.




Dear Mr. Adams:

Enclosed please find an original and two (2) copies of a Disciplinary Petition being filed by the Commission for Lawyer Discipline against Betty Barret Homminga. Ms. Homminga has designated Harris County, Texas, as her principal place of practice. Request is hereby made that the Court appoint an active District Judge who does not reside in the Administrative Judicial Region in which Respondent resides to preside in this case. Upon appointment, request is made that you notify the Respondent at the address shown below and the undersigned of the identity and address of the judge assigned:



As a practical matter, I would respectfully suggest that you inquire with the judge to be appointed as to: (1) whether she will be able to comply with the 180 day deadline by which the case must be set for trial set forth in Section 3.07 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure; and (2) whether she can accommodate compliance with Mellon Service Co., et al v. Touche Ross Co., 946 S.W.2d 862 (Tex. App. - Houston [14th Dist.] 1997), which requires that all proceedings incident to a case occur in the county of proper venue. If not, I would respectfully request that an alternate appointment be made.

Once a trial judge has been appointed, please forward the original and two (2) copies of the Disciplinary Petition, the filing fee check, also enclosed herewith, and the Court's appointing order to the District Clerk of Harris County, Texas, with the request that the suit be filed, service be obtained, and a file-marked copy of the petition be returned to the undersigned.
