OPINION

Appellant, a juvenile, was found to have engaged in delinquent conduct by committing the offenses of attempted capital murder and resisting arrest. Appellant was committed to the Texas Youth Commission with a transfer to the Institutional Division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice for a period of 12 years.

The clerk's record was filed on August 31, 1999. The reporter's record was filed on September 24, 1999. No brief was filed. After a notice of intent to dismiss was issued, appellant's counsel filed two motions for extension of time to file the brief. These extensions were granted until April 10, 2000. On June 14, 2000, notification was again transmitted to all parties of the Court's intent to dismiss the appeal for want of prosecution. *See* TEX. R. APP. P. 42.3(b). Appellant filed no response.

Accordingly, the appeal is ordered dismissed.
