#### MEMORANDUM OPINION

This is an appeal from a judgment signed March 16, 2000. On July 19, 2001, this Court issued the following order:

Appellant's brief was due June 21, 2001. This Court had previously granted appellant three extensions of time to file the brief. Upon granting the third extension, we noted we would entertain no further extensions. On July 12, 2001, appellant filed a fourth motion to extend time to file the brief.

We deny appellant's fourth motion to extend time to file the brief. Unless appellant files his brief, and a motion reasonably explaining why the brief was late, on or before August 17, 2001, the Court will dismiss the appeal for want of prosecution. *See* TEX. R. APP. P. 42.3(b).

Appellant did not file his brief on August 17, 2001, in accordance with this Court's order; rather, on August 21, 2001, appellant filed a fifth extension of time to file the brief. We deny appellant's fifth motion to extend time to file the brief and order the appeal dismissed for want of prosecution. Additionally, the Court notes that it will not consider or grant any motion for rehearing filed by appellant unless the brief accompanies such motion. Moreover, the Court will not grant appellant any extensions of time to file a motion for rehearing.

The appeal is ordered dismissed.
