

#### **VENUE**

### FIELDS COMPLAINT

Complainant, Kerri K. Fields (hereinafter referred to as "Fields") states she represents Gregory Fenwick and Texas Universal Insurance. Fields alleges that Respondent has communicated with her client Mr. Fenwick by sending him a letter directly, knowing that he is represented by counsel in violation of Rule 4.02(a) of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.

#### RULE VIOLATIONS

The acts and/or omissions of Respondent described in the above paragraph which occurred on or before January 1, 1990, constitute conduct in violation of Rule 4.02(a) [in representing a client, for communicating, causing or encouraging another to communicate about the subject of the representation with a person, organization or entity of government the lawyer knows to be represented by another lawyer regarding that subject, unless the lawyer has the consent of the other lawyer or is authorized by law to do so].

The complaint that forms the basis of this cause of action was brought to the attention of the Office of the General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Kerri K. Field's filing of a complaint on or about June 11, 1999.




Dear Mr. Adams:

Enclosed please find an original and two (2) copies of a Disciplinary Petition being filed by the Commission for Lawyer Discipline against Maryam Jamilah Zaidi. Ms. Zaidi has designated Harris County, Texas as her principal place of practice. Request is hereby made that the court appoint an active District Judge who does not reside in the Administrative Judicial Region in which Respondent resides to preside in this case. Upon appointment, request is hereby made that you notify the Respondent at the address shown below and the undersigned of the identity and address of the judge assigned:



As a practical matter, I would respectfully suggest that you inquire with the judge to be appointed as to whether he or she will be able to comply with the 180 day deadline by which the case must be set for trial set forth in Section 3.07 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. If not, I would respectfully request that an alternate appointment be made.

Once a trial judge has been appointed, please forward the original and two (2) copies of the Disciplinary Petition, the filing fee check, also enclosed herewith, and the Court's appointing order to the District Clerk of Harris County, Texas, with the request that the suit be filed, service be obtained, and a file-marked copy of the petition be returned to the undersigned.
