

DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complains of Respondent, St. James G. Chambers, Jr., (hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Discovery Control Plan

Pursuant to Rules 190.1 and 190.3, TEXAS RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE (TRCP), Petitioner intends discovery in this case to be conducted under the Level II Discovery Control Plan.

II.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann. §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

III.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar

of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of practice in Dallas County, Texas. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at 4144 N. Central Expressway, Suite 660, Dallas, Texas 75204.

IV.

On or about February 26, 1999, Millie Madison ("Madison") employed Respondent to represent her son, Jeremy Williams, in a criminal appeal. Madison met with Respondent's legal assistant, Kevin Willis ("Willis") at his request, made the payment of attorney's fees in the amount of \$2,500.00, payable to the legal assistant, rather than to Respondent.

V.

Thereafter, Willis typed, or had typed, verbatim the pro se Petition for Discretionary Review which had been handwritten by Madison's son. Further, Willis prepared and filed the petition as a pro se petition submitted by Madison's son. When Madison contacted Respondent about the case, Respondent stated he was unaware of his legal assistant's work on the case. Respondent failed to supervise Willis, his legal assistant, to ensure that his conduct was compatible with Respondent's professional obligations, and Respondent assisted his legal assistant in activities which constituted the unauthorized practice of law.

On or about June 28, 1999, Madison sent a letter to Respondent terminating the representation and requesting a return of the fee. Respondent failed to return the unearned portion of the fee which Madison had paid to Willis.

VI.

Such acts and/or omissions on the part of Respondent as are described in Paragraphs IV, and V, hereinabove, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct which violates Rules 1.15(d), 5.03(a),(b)(1), 5.05(b) and 8.04(a)(1) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

VII.

The complaint which forms the basis of the Cause of Action hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Millie Madison filing a complaint on or about September 14, 1999.

PRAYER




