
DISBURSEMENT OF ACCESS TO JUSTICE CONTRIBUTIONS

On September 21, 2012, the Texas Access to Justice Commission reported that Texas lawyers had contributed approximately \$963,110 to access to justice on their 2012 State Bar of Texas annual dues statements to support civil legal services to the poor through programs funded by the Texas Access to Justice Foundation and the Texas Bar Foundation. In consultation with the State Bar of Texas, the Texas Bar Foundation, and the Texas Access to Justice Foundation, the Commission recommends in its report that the contributions be distributed as follows. The Commission's report, to which no objections have been received, is on file with the Clerk of the Court. Accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED that, as recommended by the Commission, the State Bar of Texas and the Clerk of the Court shall transfer from the State Bar of Texas' Access to Justice Account:


1. \$200,000 to the Texas Bar Foundation, of which \$50,000 must be used for a grant to the South Texas Pro Bono Asylum Representation Project (ProBAR), and \$20,000 must be used to provide stipends for law students participating in the Access to Justice Summer Internship Program; and
2. The balance to the Texas Access to Justice Foundation, of which \$20,000 must be used to match State Bar of Texas funds for the Texas Student Loan Repayment Assistance Program.
