
Summary:

- Project completed on 9/15/2015 with Falls, Jeff Davis and Morris Counties – 9.5 months early!



Summary

- Over 117k user accounts created to-date
- EFM currently receiving 19,100 envelopes per day and over 400,000 envelopes per month
- Filing volume grew 51% over 2014 and 27% thus far in 2015
- User count grew 81% in 2014 and 26% thus far in 2015

A press conference was held in Austin on September 30th to announce the Civil e-Filing project had been completed more than nine months ahead of schedule. A few links to articles regarding the event are below:





Summary:

- Rules adopted on 10/1/2015 and allow for criminal e-filing to be generally adopted by other counties on 11/1/2015
- Criminal e-filing rules are very congruent to the civil e-filing rules
- Criminal to only be applicable on subsequent filings
- Require the clerks to obtain written consent of a majority of the judges in the county who have jurisdiction in criminal cases

Summary

- 73 offices across 47 counties interested in implementing Criminal E-Filing
- 20 counties have established tentative go-live dates
- Go-lives contingent upon written consent of criminal judges





JP eFiling

- Heavy interest in eFiling for Justice Courts
- Developing a JP Standards Committee on eFiling codes to help simplify the filing process for attorneys and legal professionals
- Use of Configuration Standards will be required for implementation of SelfHelp.eFileTexas.gov



SelfHelp.eFileTexas.gov

- Grant awarded to TLSC to fund the development of 100 new Forms/Interviews over the course of the next two years
- Completion of the project will accommodate 80-90% of pro se filings across the state
- Form/Interview development strategy to be determined by OCA



eFileTexas Springboard Certification

- Tyler Technologies was awarded Springboard Certification for the eFileTexas.gov environment on August 31, 2015
- Certification was administered and awarded by the IJIS Institute
- Certification validates the EFM to the latest version of ECF standards from OASIS

Next Steps: Now through December



1. Continue preparing for additional criminal eFiling implementations – 11/1/2015
2. Continue partnering with third party CMS vendors to establish CMS integrations
3. Begin working on the standardization of JP eFiling codes
4. Begin preparing for legislative fee changes on 12/31



CMS Integration Status




Summary

- ~57% of offices live on eFileTexas are integrated w/ their Case Management Systems (332 out of 586)
- Integration progress being made with CMS vendors:
 - 2 CMS vendors have established One-Way integration
 - 3 CMS vendors have established Two-Way integration
 - 4 CMS vendors completing Two-Way integration


EFSP Market Share & Filing Volume




EFSP Market Share by Quarter

Summary

- Over 116k user accounts created to-date
