

## THE SUPREME COURT OF TEXAS

### JUDICIAL INTERNSHIPS

The Supreme Court of Texas accepts applications for judicial internships. Interns primarily conduct research and prepare memoranda to assist the Court in deciding whether to grant a petition for review. An intern's work is supervised by the justice's staff attorney and law clerks. Interns may also have the opportunity to make an oral presentation to the Court in conference.

Applicants must have completed at least one year of law school by the time the internship starts and have a strong academic record. **Interns must receive academic credit for the internship.**

To apply, email a cover letter, résumé, unofficial law school transcript, and writing sample (in separate PDF attachments) to [martha.newton@txcourts.gov](mailto:martha.newton@txcourts.gov). Please indicate whether you would like your application to be considered by the entire Court or only by a specific justice or justices.

No application deadlines exist, but students should apply early in the semester preceding the semester in which they would like to intern. Applications are considered on a rolling basis and according to each chambers's need. Some chambers do not have an intern every semester.
