




eFileTexas Status

Transaction Volume: 7/1/2016 to 9/30/2016



Summary

- ~155k user accounts created to-date
- EFM currently receiving ~22,000 envelopes per day
- State filing portal accounts for 75.9% of transactions; remaining 24.1% stem from commercial EFSP submissions

The Court of Criminal Appeals chose to mandate e-filing in criminal matters in June 2016

- Impacts all 254 counties
- Graduated scheduled roll-out, based on county population
- Including initial filings in criminal mandate could create challenges
 - New EFM data elements needed to support CMS integrations
 - CMS applications must enhance integration to consume new data elements
 - EFSPs must include new data elements to support criminal initial



Criminal Project Plan Overview





- 23 counties in plan for Phase 4
- 56 counties in plan for Phase 5
- 136 counties in plan for Phase 6

eFileTexas Self Help Progress





Summary

- eFileTexas Self Help is now integrated with eFileTexas across the entire state
- 7 interviews currently available in Texas
- 37,221 unique users YTD (excludes on-site usage):
 - Travis Law Library
 - Williamson County Courthouse
 - Collin County Courthouse

- Partnered with the State Bar of Texas to enhance the electronic service functionality in eFileTexas
- Attorneys may now designate their preferred email address for electronic service through the [State Bar of Texas website](#)
- If no preferred email address is provided, the attorney's registered email address with the State Bar of Texas is used
- Preferred email addresses are populated in the eFileTexas public service contact list and are reflective in the application within 24 hours



Next Steps: Now through January



1. Continue the phased implementation rollout of criminal e-filing
2. Continue enriching the eFileTexas Self-Help program by adding additional interviews
3. Continue implementing Justice Courts with standard eFiling codes
