PETITION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS DENIED

On June 11, 2020, relator filed a pro se petition for writ of mandamus asking this court to compel the trial court to set a trial date. Relator also filed a motion to proceed in forma pauperis, which we grant.

Relator is represented by trial counsel below; therefore, he is not entitled to hybrid representation. *Patrick v. State*, 906 S.W.2d 481, 498 (Tex. Crim. App. 1995). The absence of a right to hybrid representation means relator's pro se mandamus petition will be treated as presenting nothing for this court's review. *See id.*; *see also Gray v. Shipley*, 877 S.W.2d 806, 806 (Tex. App.—Houston [1st Dist.] 1994, orig. proceeding). Accordingly, relator's petition for writ of mandamus is denied. *See* Tex. R. App. P. 52.8(a).
