# I. Program Updates

# A. eFileTexas/re:SearchTX/Guide and File – 2020 in review

Terry Derrick with Tyler Technologies presented an update on the eFile system and trends seen during the pandemic. He reported that despite a decrease in filings through the pandemic, the clerk's offices continue to perform filing reviews at the same level they did prior to the pandemic.

# B. eFileTexas 2.0

Mr. Kennedy reported that OCA had concluded its efforts to identify the next eFiling system vendor that would continue eFiling after the current contract expires on August 31, 2022. He announced that Tyler Technologies had been awarded the eFileTexas 2.0 project and that eFiling would continue until at least August 31, 2027.

Mr. Kennedy reported that the project will implement several new features including ECF 5, provide data analytics through Tyler's newly acquired company. He mentioned that OCA was evaluating whether or not to apply for an extension to avoid switching payment processors.

# C. Update on Uniform Case Management System (UCMS)

Mr. Kennedy spoke about the intent of the UCMS being for rural counties and included integrations with eFile, re:SearchTX, and DPS criminal history. David Slayton also raised the point that the RFO published anticipates a multi-vendor solution to promote competition and provide rural clerks with a choice.

Judge Ridgway asked if there was ever an intent for the system to make its way to the larger counties. Mr. Kennedy clarified that the focus was on rural counties and that the system requirements were geared to those counties and that larger counties may not want to adopt the system.

# D. JCIT Cybersecurity subcommittee

Dennis Van Metre briefed the committee on current cybersecurity threats. He reported that the subcommittee met and identified the need to find out what kinds of processes are already in place in the counties. Justice Simmons asked Mr. Van Metre to present additional cybersecurity threats at the next meeting.
