

#### Transaction Volume: 12/1/21 to 2/28/22






#### **Summary**

- Over 535k user accounts created todate
  - Over 515k filers
    - Over 117k registered attorneys
  - Over 15k clerks
- EFM currently receiving ~810k envelopes per month
- State filing portal accounts for 80% of transactions; remaining 20% stem from commercial EFSP submissions
- Automated Certificate of Service
   Update development work to exclude certain filing types (i.e. Proposed Orders) scheduled for completion in cycle 2 of eFileTexas 2.0

### Redaction Utilization




- Solution has been utilized more than half a million times
- Redaction utilization increased 61.93% since December
- Service implemented and available within 3 EFSPs
  - ➢ eFileTexas
  - > FileTime
  - > ProDoc



# Senate Bill 41 Update





SB41 provides efficient way to collect & disburse funds to recipients

New Financial Process (with SB41)

Requires splitting money 6x per transaction vs. 2x per transaction resulting in additional convenience (interchange) fees

## Senate Bill 41 Update – Document Purchases



SB41 standardized the pricing model for document purchases across the state, regardless of solution leveraged

New pricing model became effective on January 1, 2022 and was implemented in re:Search for consistency

\*Clerks would have made \$285,647.70 more in 2021 with new SB41 model



# AWS GovCloud Migration Update






- 99.6% of clerk volume being processed through new Review Tool
- ~32% of filing volume from state-provided portal coming through new EFSP
  - To complete migration later this year
  - Migration has no impact to clerk community
- EFM migration to complete later this year
  - Migration has no impact to end users (clerk or filing communities)

# eFileTexas 2.0 – Progress Update






- System Testing of EFM 2022 is complete
  - EFM Documentation, including ECF 5.0 specs, has been released
  - Stage deployment scheduled for week of 3/14
- User Acceptance Testing begins on 3/22



- Cycle 2 Analysis and Design complete
- Cycle 2 Execution phase has started
  - Development at 22%










- Wave 6 (<20K Population) 6/6/2022</li>






