

Section 72.083(b) of the Texas Government Code requires the Office of Court Administration to annually collect and publish a report including performance measures for each district court, statutory county court, statutory probate court, and county court. PERFORMANCE MEASURES FOR DISTRICT & COUNTY COURTS

Reporting Requirements

Section 72.083(b) of the Texas Government Code requires the Office of Court Administration to annually collect and publish a report including performance measures for each district court, statutory court, statutory probate court, and county court. All district, statutory, statutory probate, and county courts will be required to submit annual court level data for the completion of this annual report.

The report must include:

- 1. the court's clearance rate;
- 2. the average time a case is before the court from filing to disposition; and
- 3. the age of the court's active pending caseload.

The reporting timeframe for this report is defined as September 1st through August 31st. One report will be submitted for each court for the year.

Reports must be submitted on an annual basis to the Data and Research Division by November 1st. The first report will cover data from March 1, 2024 through August 31, 2024.

$HB\,2384$ - performance measures

Section <u>72.083(b)</u> of the Texas Government Code requires the Office of Court Administration to annually collect and publish a report including performance measures for **each** district court, statutory county court, statutory probate court, and county court.

Clerks are required to submit the following information for <u>each</u> district, statutory county, statutory probate, and county court annually:

- 1. the court's clearance rate;
- 2. the average time a case is before the court from filing to disposition; and
- 3. the age of the court's active pending caseload.



1. CLEARANCE RATE

- For each district or county court in your jurisdiction, report:
 - 1. The number of active pending cases as of September 1
 - 2. The number of cases **filed** during the year
 - 3. The number of cases **reactivated** during the year
 - 4. The number of cases disposed or adjudicated (juvenile) during the year
 - 5. The number of cases placed on **inactive** status during the year
 - 6. The number of **active pending** cases as of August 31
- Most information **already reported** on Judicial Council Monthly Reports.
- Exception is dispositions/adjudications and pending for probate, guardianship and mental health cases.



2. AVERAGE TIME FROM FILING TO DISPOSITION

For **each district or county court** in your jurisdiction, report the number of cases disposed within each timeframe by case type:

Felony: 90 Days or Less, 91 to 180 Days, 181 to 365 Days, Over 365 Days, Total Cases.

Misdemeanor: 30 Days or Less, 31 to 60 Days, 61 to 90 Days, Over 90 Days, Total Cases.

Civil: 3 Months or Less, Over 3 to 6 Months, Over 6 to 12 Months, Over 12 to 18 Months, Over 18 Months, Total Cases.

Family: 3 Months or Less, Over 3 to 6 Months, Over 6 to 12 Months, Over 12 to 18 Months, Over 18 Months, Total Cases.

Juvenile: 30 Days or Less, 31 to 90 Days, 91 to 180 Days, Over 180 Days, Total Cases.

Probate and guardianship and ancillary cases: 3 Months or Less, Over 3 to 6 Months, Over 6 to 12 Months, Over 12 to 18 Months, Over 18 Months, Total Cases.

Mental health commitments: 7 Days or Less, 8 to 14 Days, 15 to 21 Days, 22 to 28 Days, Over 28 Days, Total Cases.

- Most information already reported on Judicial Council Monthly Reports.
- Exception is probate, guardianship and mental health cases.



3. AGE OF COURT'S ACTIVE PENDING CASELOAD

• For **each district or county court** in your jurisdiction, report the age of the active cases pending before the court, as measured by the time from date of filing or reopening to the reporting date (August 31).

Felony: 90 Days or Less, 91 to 180 Days, 181 to 365 Days, Over 365 Days, Total Cases.

Misdemeanor: 30 Days or Less, 31 to 60 Days, 61 to 90 Days, Over 90 Days, Total Cases.

Civil: 3 Months or Less, Over 3 to 6 Months, Over 6 to 12 Months, Over 12 to 18 Months, Over 18 Months, Total Cases.

Family: 3 Months or Less, Over 3 to 6 Months, Over 6 to 12 Months, Over 12 to 18 Months, Over 18 Months, Total Cases.

Juvenile: 30 Days or Less, 31 to 90 Days, 91 to 180 Days, Over 180 Days, Total Cases.

Probate and guardianship and ancillary cases: 3 Months or Less, Over 3 to 6 Months, Over 6 to 12 Months, Over 12 to 18 Months, Over 18 Months, Total Cases.

Mental health commitments: 7 Days or Less, 8 to 14 Days, 15 to 21 Days, 22 to 28 Days, Over 28 Days, Total Cases.

• Timeframes same as those used for Age of Cases Disposed.

COUNTIES POPULATION OVER 1 MILLION REPORTING

Reporting Requirements

Section 71.035(a) of the Texas Government Code requires counties with a population of at least one million to include additional information in their monthly reports for each district and county court in the county.

The reports must include:

- 1. The number of cases assigned to the court;
- 2. the case clearance rate for the court;
- 3. the number of cases disposed by the court;
- 4. the number of jury panels empaneled for the court;
- 5. the number of orders of continuance for an attorney before the court or by the court;
- 6. the number of pleas accepted by the court;
- 7. the number of cases tried by the judge of the court or before a jury; and
- 8. the number of cases tried before a visiting or associate judge of the court.

Reports must be submitted to OCA no later than the 20th day of the month following the month reported.

Reporting by court will begin April 2024 starting with March 2024 data. OCA will publish the information every month at the link below. In the interim, the current District Court and County Court Monthly Court Activity Reports containing countywide information will be posted for each county.

Section <u>71.035(a)</u> of the Texas Government Code requires counties with a **population of at least one million** to include additional information in their monthly reports for **each district and county court** in the county.

- 1. The number of cases assigned to the court;
- 2. the case clearance rate for the court;
- 3. the number of cases disposed by the court;
- 4. the number of jury panels empaneled for the court;

1, 2, 3, 4 and 6 already captured at county level.

- 5. the number of orders of continuance for an attorney before the court or by the court;
- 6. the number of pleas accepted by the court;
- 7. the number of cases tried by the judge of the court or before a jury; and
- 8. the number of cases tried before a visiting or associate judge of the court.

5, 7 and 8 are new.



NEW - ORDERS OF CONTINUANCE

Report:

- 1. The number of rulings or orders granting continuance for an attorney in cases set for trial during the month.
- 2. The number of rulings or orders **denying continuance for an attorney in cases set for trial** during the month.

Does not include routine resets or amended scheduling orders.



NEW – CASES TRIED BY DIFFERENT JUDGES

Report the number of bench trials and jury trials held in the court by

- 1. an elected judge
- 2. an associate judge, magistrate, or other county-employed judicial officer
- 3. a visiting judge on short term assignment
- 4. a visiting judge on long term assignment

long-term assignment to impact courts/dockets, COVID backlog-related dockets, or resulting from the retirement, resignation, or prolonged illness (exceeding 2 weeks) of the judge; suspension of the judge by the State Commission on Judicial Conduct; or the creation of a new bench in which an appointment has not been made.



Reports from March 2024 forward will be posted at the court level.
