ORDER

On this day came on for consideration the motion for acceptance of resignation as attorney and counselor at law of James R. Vidouria, together with the Concurring Motion of the Grievance Committee for State Bar District No. 10-A, State Bar of Texas, and the Certification of the General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas. The Court has reviewed said Motions and Certification and finds each to be legally sufficient. The Court, being advised that such resignation is tendered in lieu of disciplinary action, and being of the opinion that such resignation is in the public interest and will meet the ends of justice, hereby concludes that the following order is appropriate.

IT IS ORDERED that the law license of James R. Vidouria of San Antonio, Texas, State Bar Card No. 20579300, heretofore issued by this Court, be cancelled and his name be dropped and deleted from the list of persons licensed to practice law in Texas.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the said James R. Vidouria be and he hereby is permanently enjoined from practicing law in the State of Texas, holding himself out as an attorney at law, performing any legal services for others, giving legal advice to

others, accepting any fee directly or indirectly for legal services, appearing as counsel or in any representative capacity in any proceeding in any Texas court or before any Texas administrative body or holding himself out to others or using his name in any manner in conjunction with the words "Attorney at Law," "Counselor at Law," or "Lawyer."

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that James R. Vidouria, within thirty (30) days from the date this Order is signed, notify each of his current clients in writing of this resignation, keeping a copy of all such notifications until October 1, 1992. In addition to such notification, James R. Vidouria is ORDERED to return all files, papers, monies and other property in his possession belonging to clients and former clients to the respective clients or former clients within thirty (30) days from the date this Order is signed. James R. Vidouria is further ORDERED to file with this Court within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, an affidavit stating that all current clients have been notified of James R. Vidouria's resignation and that all files, papers, monies and other property belonging to all clients and former clients have been returned as ordered herein. If James R. Vidouria has been unable to return any property, file or papers to any former client or current client, James R. Vidouria shall file an affidavit with this Court, showing with particularity the efforts made with respect to each particular client.

James R. Vidouria is ORDERED to send copies of all affidavits referred to herein to the General Counsel's Office, State Bar of Texas, P.O. Box 12487, Capitol Station, Austin, Texas 78711.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that James R. Vidouria shall, on or before thirty (30) days from the date this Order is signed, notify in writing each and every justice of the peace, judge, magistrate, and chief justice of each and every court in which James R. Vidouria may have any matter pending of his resignation, the style and cause number of the pending matter(s), and the name, address and telephone number of the client(s) James R. Vidouria is representing in that Court.

Receipt of James R. Vidouria's Texas law license and permanent State Bar Card is hereby acknowledged.

The Clerk of this Court shall forward a certified copy of this Order to James R. Vidouria at 1131 Babcock Road, Suite 103, San Antonio, Texas 78201.
