Movant, **LAWRENCE R. MEDFORD**, pursuant to Part X, Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure, moves the Court to accept his resignation as an attorney and counselor at law, showing the Court:

I.

Movant hereby resigns as an attorney and counselor at law in lieu of disciplinary sanction for having committed professional misconduct.

Since January 1991 Movant was serving as Justice of the Peace, Galveston County Precinct No. 7. Investigation revealed that between July 1991 and April 1992 Movant stole approximately \$14,413.80 in fine money that had been paid to his court by numerous defendants.

Movant has already made full restitution to Galveston County regarding the stolen funds. He resigned as Justice of the Peace for Precinct No. 7 on May 7, 1992.

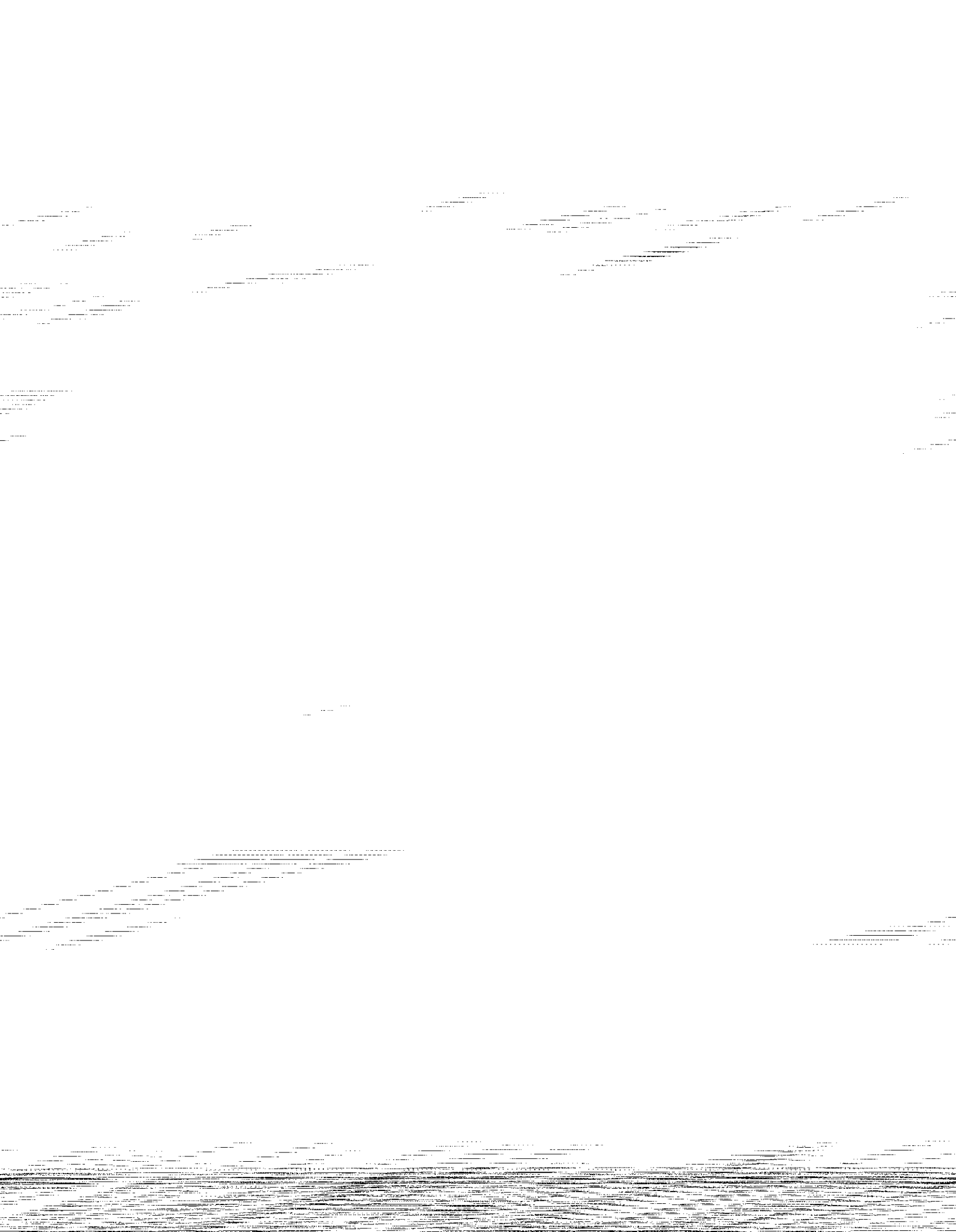

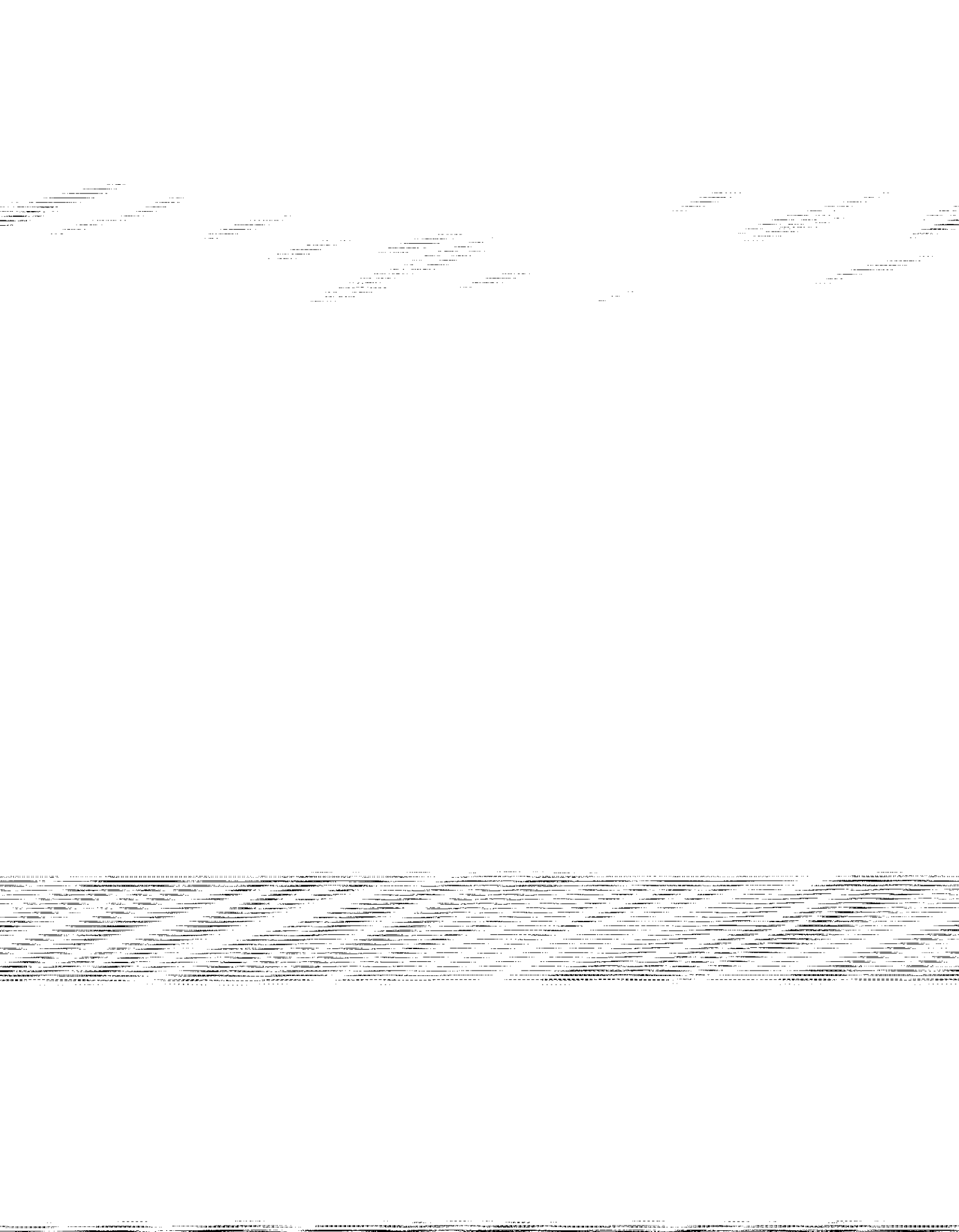
Movant attaches hereto and hereby surrenders his license and permanent State Bar Card issued by the Court on December 15, 1989.




WHEREFORE, the State Bar of Texas moves the Court to accept the resignation in lieu of discipline and grant the motion filed by Movant.
