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RESPONSE OF THE CHIEF DISCIPLINARY COUNSEL TO
    THE MOTION FOR ACCEPTANCE OF RESIGNATION
        AS ATTORNEY AND COUNSELOR AT LAW

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TO THE HONORABLE SUPREME COURT OF TEXAS:
COMES NOW the Chief Disciplinary Counsel of the State Bar of Texas and, in accordance with Part $X$ of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure, files this Response on behalf of the State Bar of Texas, acting through the Texas Commission for Lawyer Discipline, to the Motion for Acceptance of Resignation as Attorney and Counselor at Law of Movant, David Turlington.

The acceptance of the resignation of David Turlington is in the best interest of the public and the profession. There is currently pending a disciplinary action against David Turlington numbered 92-CI-00887 and styled "The State Bar of Texas v. David Turlington," in the 37th Judicial District Court of Bexar County, Texas; there is also currently pending a disciplinary proceeding against David Turlington numbered S-0069200098 and styled John O. McCracken v. David Truett Turlington, before the Grievance Committee for State Bar District Number 10B, State Bar of Texas.

The Professional Misconduct with which David Turlington is charged is as follows:

## VIELMAS COMPLAINT

Movant, David Turlington, represented Fernanda Vielmas individually and as legal guardian and next friend of her minor
son, Manuel ortiz III, in a personal injury resulting from an automobile accident in or around April, 1985. Turlington negotiated a settlement of the suit that included $\$ 42,000.00$ to be paid to Fernanda Vielmas, as legal guardian and managing conservator of Manuel Ortiz III, to be set aside for payment of accrued hospital, doctor and other medical expenses. A settlement draft in the amount of $\$ 125,000.00$ was issued payable jointly to Fernanda Vielmas and Turlington. Mrs. Vielmas endorsed the settlement draft and turned it over to Turlington for deposit. Turlington failed to keep that portion of the funds which had been earmarked for payment of medical bills and expenses in a trust account or some other separate, identifiable account, but rather commingled those funds with his own personal or business funds. Turlington failed to promptly deliver those funds to Mrs. Vielmas.

By his conduct as alleged in the Vielmas Complaint, Movant David Turlington has violated Disciplinary Rules 9-102(A) and 9102(B)(4) of the Texas Code of Professional Responsibility.

## MCCRACKEN COMPLAINT

Movant, David Turlington, represented John McCracken with reference to McCracken's lawsuit against Central Park Mall Joint Venture et al. The lawsuit was settled on August 17, 1990, with Turlington receiving on behalf of McCracken the sum of $\$ 250,000.00$ cash and a note in the amount of $\$ 250,000.00$ due and payable within ten months of settlement date. The note was paid timely to Turlington in accordance with the settlement agreement. Turlington
distributed the sum of $\$ 341,070.88$ to John McCracken. Turlington misappropriated the sum of not less than $\$ 158,929.12$, which said monies were used to fund a complex case, unrelated to McCracken's legal matters, in which Turlington was acting as attorney. By his conduct as alleged in the McCracken Complaint, Movant David Turlington has violated Rules $1.14(\mathrm{a})$ and $8.04(\mathrm{a})(3)$ of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

In view of David Turlington's execution of his resignation as an attorney and counselor at law, and in anticipation of the Court's acceptance of same, the Chief Disciplinary Counsel does not anticipate going forward with the pending disciplinary action in district court nor with the pending disciplinary proceding before the District $10 B$ Grievance Committee, and intends to obtain an Order of Non-Suit in said disciplinary action upon entry of Order by the Supreme Court of Texas accepting the motion for resignation of David Turlington and deleting his name from the list of persons licensed to practice law in the state of Texas.
