## ORDER OF THE SUPREME COURT OF TEXAS

Misc. Docket No. 93- 0176

The Supreme Court of Texas has received from the Texas Wesleyan University School of Law a Petition for Wavier of Rule I.(a)(3) of the Rules Governing Admission to the Bar of Texas. The Texas Wesleyan University School of Law has made application for provisional approval by the American Bar Association, and has received a site evaluation team of the American Bar Association Section on Legal Education and Admissions to the Bar. The administration of Texas Wesleyan University and of its Law School are working to respond to and satisfy the concerns of the American Bar Association Accreditation Committee.

The Supreme Court will appoint a site inspection committee to be chaired by Justice Cornyn, which will inspect the faculty, staff and facilities of Texas Wesleyan School of Law as soon as possible.

Subject to a favorable report from that committee, the Supreme Court grants a waiver of Rule I.(a)(3) of the Rules Governing Admission to the Bar of Texas and orders that any person who graduates and has been granted a J. D. degree from Texas Wesleyan University School of Law shall be eligible to take the Texas Bar Examinations offered in February and July, 1994, and in February 1995, subject to meeting all other admission and eligibility requirements as contained in the Rules Governing Admission to the Bar of Texas.

No extension of this waiver will be granted.
