TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, Franklin Y. Wright, (hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann. §81.001, <u>et seq.</u> (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

П.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of practice in Bexar County, Texas. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at his business address located at 3107 Broadway, San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas 78209-6794. On or about November 15, 1988, Lillie R. Duran (hereinafter called "Duran") hired Respondent to represent her in her claim for damages against two defendants after she was injured in an automobile accident in and around September, 1988.

IV.

Respondent thereafter settled Duran's case with each of the defendants. The first case was settled in and around November, 1991, for \$6,500.00, and the second case was settled in and around June, 1992, for \$100,000.00. Although Respondent received and disbursed settlement funds on Duran's behalf, and Duran requested a settlement accounting on various occasions, Respondent did not provide Duran with an accounting detailing his receipts and disbursements until after she had filed a grievance against him with the State Bar of Texas.

V.

Between in and around November, 1988, and in and around April, 1993, Duran referred at least fifteen (15) personal injury clients to Respondent for representation, for which Respondent paid Duran a referral or "investigative" fee. Such investigative fees were paid to Duran by Respondent although she did not actually perform any investigative services for any of the cases she referred to Respondent. Furthermore, none of the clients referred by Duran to Respondent were billed by him for investigative services purportedly performed by Duran on their behalf.

Wright - Disciplinary Petition Page 2 Such acts and/or omissions on the part of Respondent as are described in Paragraphs III., IV. and V. hereinabove which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct which violates Rules 1.14(b) and/or 7.01(i) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

VII.

The complaint which forms the basis of the Cause of Action hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Lillie R. Duran filing a complaint on or about October 5, 1993.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays for judgment that Respondent be disciplined as the facts shall warrant; and that Petitioner have such other relief to which entitled, including costs of Court and attorney's fees.
