

TO THE HONORABLE SUPREME COURT OF TEXAS:

Pursuant to Part X of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure, James M. McCormack, Chief Disciplinary Counsel, hereby files this response on behalf of the State Bar of Texas, acting by and through the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, to the Motion for Acceptance of Resignation in Lieu of Discipline filed by R. Mark Schultz, and would show as follows:

I.

The acceptance by the Court of the Resignation of R. Mark Schultz is in the best interest of the public and of the profession.

II.

Respondent failed to hold Client funds separate from Respondent's funds; failed to pay and distribute Client funds as agreed; Respondent mis-stated the disposition of Client funds in his care, constituting a false statement of a material fact.

Respondent's professional misconduct resulted in a monetary loss to Clients in excess of over \$190,000.00.

The above stated facts support a violation of Rules 1.14 (a), 1.14 (b), 1.14 (c), 4.01 (a), 4.01 (b), 8.04 (a)(1), 8.04 (a)(2), 8.04 (a)(3), 8.04 (a)(12) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

WHEREFORE, the State Bar of Texas, moves the Court to accept the resignation in lieu of discipline and grant the motion filed by Movant.
