DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas ("Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, WILLIAM A. BROWN, Jr. ("Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Texas Government Code Annotated §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988 and supp. 1994), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint that forms the basis of this Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

II.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent's principal place of practice is Harris County, Texas, and therefore venue is appropriate in Harris County, Texas, pursuant to Rule 3.03 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. Respondent may be served at his business address located at 11777 Katy Freeway, Suite 101, Houston, Texas, 77079.

Kenneth R. Fontenot ("Fontenot") and Lawrence E. Snyder ("Snyder") sued their former landlord in Cause No. 643,461, *Lawrence E. Snyder and Kenneth R. Fontenot vs. E. James Babin*, in the County Civil Court at Law No. Three (3) in Harris County, Texas. Respondent represented the defendant, E. James Babin ("Babin").

IV.

On or about April 10, 1995, the depositions of Fontenot and Snyder were taken, and pursuant to Respondent's request, Fontenot and Snyder produced, in good faith, certain personal property for Respondent's inspection. These items, two pairs of leather boots and a book of presidential portraits, were marked as exhibits. Following the deposition, Respondent failed and refused to return the property. Fontenot and/or Snyder made repeated requests that Respondent return the property, but to no avail. By letter dated May 26, 1995, Dara Leigh Bloom ("Bloom"), attorney for Fontenot and Snyder, insisted that Respondent return the property by May 31, 1995, but Respondent refused to comply.

V.

Thereafter, on or about August 10, 1995, a hearing was held on the Plaintiff's Motion to Compel, Motion for Return of Property and for Sanctions (the "Motion"). The Order granting the Motion was signed that same day, August 10, 1995. Respondent was ordered to return the property, by delivering it Bloom's office on or before 5:00 p.m. on August 22, 1995. Respondent failed to comply with the Court's Order. It was further ordered that Babin/Respondent pay reasonable attorney's fees to Bloom in the amount of \$250.00 on or before 5:00 p.m. on August 22, 1995. But Babin/Respondent failed to remit the payment

to Bloom.

VI.

The acts and/or omissions of the Respondent described in Paragraphs III-V above, which occurred on or after January 1, 1990, constitute conduct in violation of Rules 1.14(b), 3.02, 3.04(d), 4.04(a), and 8.04(a)(1) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

VII.

The complaint that forms the basis of this cause of action was brought to the attention of the Office of the General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Fontenot's filing of a complaint on or about July 18, 1995.

Prayer

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE respectfully prays that this Court discipline Respondent WILLIAM A. BROWN, Jr., as the facts shall warrant; and that the Petitioner have all other relief to which it may show itself to be justly entitled, including costs of court and attorney's fees.
