DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State Bar of Texas (hereinafter called "Petitioner"), complaining of Respondent, Derek A. Howard, (hereinafter called "Respondent"), showing the Court:

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann. §81.001, <u>et seq.</u> (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

II.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of practice in Travis County, Texas. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at his business address located at 100 Congress, Suite 1720, Austin, Travis County, Texas 78701.

NO.

On or about September 30, 1993, John Mertens retained Derek A. Howard, Respondent, to represent Mr. Mertens in a claim for damages against Kino Express and/or Airborne Express, arising out of an alleged wrongful termination of employment by Kino Express and/or Airborne Express. The employment contract or retainer agreement prepared by Respondent provided for a 33 1/3% contingent fee for any recovery "prior to trial" and 40% of any recovery "after trial begins," and made references to "judgment," "authority ... to sign all ... pleadings ... and papers that shall be reasonably necessary to pursue litigation" and to "assign this case ... for preparation and litigation." Such language caused Mr. Mertens to believe that Respondent would file a lawsuit against Mr. Mertens' employer. Mr. Mertens had been terminated from employment by Kino Express for alleged activities by him on behalf of Teamsters Union Local 657. An unfair labor practices charge was previously filed by the Teamsters Union on behalf of Mr. Mertens with the National Labor Relations Board and had been withdrawn but was refiled on October 1, 1993. An attorney in Respondent's firm working with Respondent on behalf of Mr. Mertens was told on October 1, 1993 by the attorney for the Teamsters Union that the unfair labor practice had been withdrawn but was to be refiled. Filing suit was not in actuality a legal option based upon federal law giving the National Labor Relations Board exclusive jurisdiction of this type of matter. Respondent thereafter did not initiate litigation against Kino Express and/or Airborne Express or otherwise pursue such

claim, independently of the unfair labor practices charge. Respondent further failed to adequately explain or provide to Mr. Mertens sufficient information at the time he undertook the representation or thereafter as to why Respondent would not or could not initiate litigation or otherwise pursue the claim directly against, the Kino Express and/or Airborne Express.

IV.

The above-described acts or omissions of Respondent constitute violations of Rule 1.03(a) and 1.03(b), <u>Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct</u>.

v. .

The complaint which forms the basis of the Cause of Action hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by John Mertens filing a complaint on or about July 30, 1994.

VI.

Pursuant to Rule 3.10, <u>Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure</u>, Petitioner would further show that Respondent has previously been disciplined for professional misconduct by Judgment Of Public Reprimand, dated October 7, 1993, in Case No. F1059300581, styled Complaint Against Derek Alden Howard, Austin, Texas, Before The Grievance Committee For State Bar District No. 9A, State Bar Of Texas.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays for judgment that Respondent be disciplined as the facts shall warrant; and that
