TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

COMES NOW Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, a committee of the State Bar of Texas, complaining of Respondent, James E. Tatum, showing the Court:

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex.Gov't Code Ann. §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988 and supp. 1994), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed with the State Bar of Texas on or after May 1, 1992.

II.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of practice in Harris County, Texas. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at his place of business located at 8703 Bonhomme, Houston, Harris County, Texas 77074-6717.

On or about January 20, 1993, Andrew Sigmund wired Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) to Respondent, James E. Tatum's trust account. On or about August 12, 1993, Mr. Sigmund wired another Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to Respondent's trust account. Sigmund and Respondent had agreed that the Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) was to be held in trust by Respondent, James E. Tatum, and was not to be used unless and until Respondent received notice that the funding for a timber purchase agreement had been secured.

Mr. Sigmund did not obtain funding of the timber purchase agreement, and he requested a return of the Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00). Respondent has refused to return the funds.

IV.

By refusing to return to Mr. Sigmund the \$25,000.00 which he gave to Respondent to hold in trust, Respondent failed to promptly deliver to his client any funds which he was entitled to receive, in violation of Rule 1.14(b) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct. By refusing to return to Mr. Sigmund the \$25,000.00) which Sigmund gave to Respondent to hold in trust, Respondent engaged in conduct involving dishonesty, deceit, fraud or misrepresentation in violation of Rule 8.04(a)(3) of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

V.

The complaint which forms the basis of this lawsuit as hereinabove set forth was brought to the attention of the Office of the General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by the filing of a complaint by Andrew Sigmund on or about October 5, 1995.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays for judgment that Respondent be disciplined by reprimand, suspension, or disbarment, as the facts shall warrant; and that Petitioner have such other and further relief to which entitled, including costs of Court and attorney's fees.
