# **DISCIPLINARY PETITION**

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Petitioner, the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State

Bar of Texas, (hereinafter called "Petitioner") complains of Respondent JOHN M.

McDERMOTT (hereinafter called "Respondent") showing the court:

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to the State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann. §81.001 et seq. (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure, and the State Bar Rules. The complaint that forms the basis of the Disciplinary Petition was filed after May 1, 1992.

II.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of and has his principal place of business in Harris County, Texas, and therefore venue is appropriate in Harris County, Texas, pursuant to Rule 3.03 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. An officer may serve citation on Respondent at his business located at 6776 Southwest Freeway, Suite 150, Houston, Texas 77074.

Reginald Williams retained Respondent in June 1994 to represent him in an uncontested divorce, and paid Respondent two hundred three dollars (\$203.00) for fees and costs. After preparing a petition and attempting to file it, Respondent learned that an active divorce case involving Williams was already pending in Cause No. 93-051972, styled *In the Matter of the Marriage of Reginald Wayne Williams and Linda F. Williams*, in the 245th Judicial District Court of Harris County, Texas. On or about September 16, 1994, Respondent learned that a Decree of Divorce had been entered in Cause No. 93-51972 on or about December 16, 1993. The parties involved in that divorce were the same as those involved in the divorce for which Respondent had been hired. Despite the fact that a divorce decree had already been entered for his client before he was hired, Respondent has not returned the filing fees paid to him by Williams. Although Williams made repeated requests for information regarding the status of his case, Respondent did not respond to these requests from his client. Respondent did not explain to Williams that the previously filed lawsuit had obtained the divorce.

On or about January 11, 1996, Respondent received notice from the State Bar of Texas that of Williams' complaint filed against him. The notice requested that Respondent furnish a written response to Williams' allegations to the State Bar of Texas. Respondent failed to timely file such a written response to the State Bar of Texas.

#### IV.

The acts and/or omissions of the Respondent described in Paragraph III, constitute conduct in violation of Rules 1.01(b)(1) [neglecting a legal matter entrusted to him]; 1.03(a)[failing to keep a client reasonably informed about the status of a matter and promptly

comply with reasonable requests for information]; 1.14(a) [failure to safeguard property in which his client has an interest]; 1.15(d) [failing, upon termination of representation, to reasonably protect a client's interests, file notice to the client to seek other counsel, or to surrender papers and property which belongs to the client]; 8.01(b) [failure to respond to a lawful demand for information from a disciplinary authority] and 8.04(a)(8) [failing to timely furnish a district grievance committee with a response or other information as required] of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, and Part 1.06(Q) of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.

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The complaint that forms the basis of this cause of action was brought to the attention of the Office of the General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Reginald Williams filing a complaint on or about December 13, 1995.

#### **Prayer**

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE respectfully prays that this Court discipline Respondent John M. McDermott, by disbarment, suspension or reprimand as the facts shall warrant, and that the Petitioner have all other relief to which it may show itself to be justly entitled, including costs of court and attorney's fees.
