TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Comes now, Petitioner, COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas, complaining of Respondent, WADE VINCENT SHANG, and in support thereof would respectfully show the Court the following:

Parties

Petitioner is the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent, WADE VINCENT SHANG, State Bar Number 00789029, is an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of Bexar County, Texas and may be served with process at 6100 Bandera Road, Suite 412, San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas 78238-1653, his usual place of business. No service is requested at this time.

<u>Venue</u>

Respondent resides in and maintains his principal place of practice in Bexar County, Texas. The alleged professional misconduct occurred in Bexar County, Texas. Accordingly, pursuant to Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure 3.03, venue is proper in Bexar County, Texas. I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann., Sec. 81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of this action was filed on or about December 1, 1995. The acts and conduct of Respondent, as hereinafter alleged, constitute professional misconduct.

II.

On or about March 23, 1995, Tommy Zamarripa and members of his family were injured in an automobile accident. On or about March 30, 1996, Mr. Zamarripa and his wife, Yolanda, consulted Respondent and signed an Attorney-Client Representation Agreement. The agreement contained a contingent fee arrangement related to any recovery made as a result of the personal injuries suffered by Mr. & Mrs. Zamarripa and their minor daughter, Roxanne. Respondent also represented Mr. Zamarripa's two nephews who were passengers in the Zamarripa automobile at the time of the collision.

III.

On or about March 29, 1996, Mr. Zamarripa received a telephone call from a woman claiming to be employed by "Legal Aid". The woman on the telephone told Mr. Zamarripa to meet Rene Hernandez at the St. Thomas Clinic and Mr. Hernandez would take care of him. Mr. Zamarripa went to the St. Thomas clinic where he was met by Mr. Hernandez. Mr. Hernandez told Mr. Zamarripa to hire Respondent. Mr. Zamarripa was not related to nor had

WADE VINCENT SHANG - Disciplinary Petition Page 2 of 5 he ever met Mr. Hernandez prior to the meeting at the St. Thomas Clinic. Mr. Zamarripa did not at any time seek the advice from any person at "Legal Aid".

IV.

During the course of the representation, Mr. Zamarripa made numerous requests for information from Respondent related to the amount of medical bills, the offers to settle and about the status of the case. Mr. Zamarripa's telephone calls were not returned by Respondent and Respondent failed to keep Mr. Zamarripa informed about the status of his case to the extent necessary to permit Mr. Zamarripa to make informed decisions regarding the representation.

V.

In December of 1995, Mr. Zamarripa was told that the defendant's insurance carrier had made an offer to settle the case. At the time Mr. Zamarripa was confronted with the offers to settle, he had not been provided with sufficient information to make an informed decision regarding the settlement. When Mr. Zamarripa questioned Respondent's staff about the settlement for his minor daughter's case, Respondent was unable or unwilling to explain the settlement to Mr. Zamarripa sufficiently to allow Mr. Zamarripa to make an informed decision.

VI.

On or about December 1, 1995, Mr. Zamarripa filed a complaint with the State Bar of Texas. Upon Respondent learning of the complaint, Respondent called Mr. Zamarripa into his office and told Mr. Zamarripa that he could not represent his daughter as long as the complaint was on file. Through misrepresentations, Respondent coerced Mr. Zamarripa into writing a letter to the State Bar attempting to withdraw the complaint. Respondent's representation of Mr.

Zamarripa and his family reasonably appeared to be or become adversely limited when Respondent, pursuing his own interest in discharging the grievance against him, dictated Mr. Zamarripa's letter to the State Bar to withdraw the complaint and made the written withdraw letter a condition of Respondent's continued representation of Mr. Zamarripa's daughter.

VII.

The conduct of Respondent described above constitutes a violation of the following Texas

Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct:

Rule 1.03(a) -- A lawyer shall keep a client reasonably informed about the status of a matter and promptly comply with reasonable requests for information.

Rule 1.03(b) -- A lawyer shall explain a matter to the extent reasonably necessary to permit the client to make informed decisions regarding the representation.

Rule 1.06(b)(2) -- A lawyer shall not represent a person if the representation of that person reasonably appears to be or become adversely limited by the lawyer's responsibilities to another client or by the lawyer's own interests.

Rule 8.04(a)(3) -- A lawyer shall not engage in conduct involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit or misrepresentation.

<u>PRAYER</u>

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner prays that a judgment of professional misconduct be entered against Respondent imposing an appropriate sanction as the facts shall warrant and that Petitioner have such other relief to which it is entitled, including costs of court and attorney's fees.
