DISCIPLINARY PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF THE COURT:

Petitioner, the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas, complains of Respondent VINCENT A. LANNIE as follows:

1.

Petitioner files this Disciplinary Petition pursuant to the State Bar Act, Texas Government Code Annotated §81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988 and supp. 1995), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint that forms the basis of this Disciplinary Petition was filed on or after May 1, 1992.

II.

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent's principal place of practice is Harris County, Texas. Venue is, therefore, appropriate in Harris County, Texas, pursuant to Rule 3.03 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. An officer may serve process on Respondent at his business address located at 3814 Highway 146, Baytown, Harris County, Texas 77521.

On or about October 6, 1995, Respondent received notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, of a complaint filed against him by Kenneth Milburn. The notice directed Respondent to provide a written response to the State Bar of Texas to the allegations made by Mr. Milburn against him. Respondent wholly failed to respond to the notice and request.

On or about December 1, 1995, Respondent received by certified mail, return receipt requested, a subpoena issued by the Grievance Committee for State Bar District No. 4 of the State Bar of Texas. The subpoena commanded Respondent to appear before the Grievance Committee for State Bar District No. 4 of the State Bar of Texas on December 13, 1995, to give testimony regarding the Milburn complaint. Respondent failed to appear, and he failed to assert legal grounds for his failure to do so.

IV.

The acts and/or omissions of the Respondent described in Paragraph III above constitute a violation of Rule 8.04(a)(8) [failing to timely furnish to a district grievance committee a response or other information as required without timely asserting a privilege or other legal ground for failure to do so] of the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, and a violation of Part 1.06(Q) of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.

The facts that form the basis of this cause of action were brought to the attention of the Office of the General Counsel of the State Bar of Texas by Kenneth Milburn filing a complaint on or about October 2, 1995.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner, Commission For Lawyer Discipline, respectfully prays that this Court discipline Respondent, Vincent A. Lannie, by reprimand, suspension, or disbarment, as the facts shall warrant, and that the Petitioner, Commission for Lawyer Discipline, have all other relief to which it may show itself to be justly entitled, including an award of costs of court and attorney's fees.
