
The Commission for Lawyer Discipline v. Charles Spector

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF SAID COURT:

Comes now, Petitioner, COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas, complaining of Respondent, CHARLES SPECTOR, and in support thereof would respectfully show the Court the following:

Parties

Petitioner is the COMMISSION FOR LAWYER DISCIPLINE, a committee of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent, CHARLES SPECTOR, State Bar No. 18903500, is an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Texas and is a member of the State Bar of Texas. Respondent is a resident of El Paso, El Paso County, Texas and may be served with process at 1401 E. Yadell Drive, El Paso, El Paso County, Texas 78229-3200, his usual place of business.

Venue

Respondent maintains his principal place of practice in El Paso County, Texas. The alleged professional misconduct occurred in part in El Paso County, Texas. Accordingly, pursuant to Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure 3.03, venue is proper in El Paso County, Texas.

Professional Misconduct

I.

Petitioner brings this disciplinary action pursuant to State Bar Act, Tex. Gov't. Code Ann., Sec. 81.001, et seq. (Vernon 1988), the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct and the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. The complaint which forms the basis of this action was filed on or about October 6, 1995. The acts and conduct of Respondent, as hereinafter alleged, constitute professional misconduct.

II.

On or about June, 1994, Respondent was hired by Henry Duran to pursue a wrongful termination claim against his former employer.

III.

From June, 1994 to June, 1995, Mr. Duran made numerous telephone calls to Respondent's office in an attempt to obtain a status report. Respondent failed to respond to reasonable requests for information, and failed to keep several appointments with Mr. Duran.

IV.

The conduct of Respondent described above constitutes violations of the following Disciplinary Rule:

Rule 1.03(a) -- A lawyer shall keep a client reasonably informed about the status of a matter and promptly comply with reasonable requests for information.

PRAYER


