

On June 12, 1997, after I received the annual Membership Fee Statement from the State Bar of Texas, I wrote to confirm my intention to resign from the State Bar of Texas. I have enclosed a copy of that letter. I now see that I may have addressed that letter to the wrong office. Please accept this letter as notice of my resignation from the State Bar of Texas, effective June 1, 1997.

Shortly after I mailed my June 12 letter, I received your June 17, 1997 letter describing the process for reinstatement to active status. Recently, I received a second Membership Fee Statement with a July 1, 1997 reminder letter from the Clerk of the Supreme Court of Texas.

Since I was admitted to the State Bar of Texas in 1988, I have never practiced law in the State of Texas.
