

SB 1096-Guardianship Registry as of September 30, 2020







Exceptional Item #1 Restore Cuts to Critical Programs

- Only 70% of positions filled for GAFEDP (Guardianship Program) due to 5% cut. Restored positions will allow for:
 - Increased compliance reviews
 - Expansion of financial audits of guardianships
 - Identify abuse and fraud throughout the state
- Restore travel costs for child support and child protection courts
 - Cut travel due to pandemic, but predict travel to hear dockets will resume to normal levels in 2022-2023 biennium
- Cost =\$768,693 over biennium









Jury Trials During COVID-19



- Pre COVID-19: Averaging 186 Jury Trials a Week
- SCOTX Emergency Order prohibited in person jury trials until October 1
- Experimental trials allowed on a limited basis if approved by OCA and Regional Presiding Judges from June 1 – October 1
- 97 requests to hold a jury trial were received
 - 34 civil
 - 63 criminal
- 45 cases were tried by a jury to verdict (2 were acquitted by the jury)
 - 20 civil
 - 25 criminal
- 2 cases resulted in mistrial due to COVID issue
 - Both criminal
- 40 Grand Juries Empaneled



Exceptional Item #2 – COVID-19 Impacted Critical Needs

- 2 FTEs to provide needed Zoom and remote assistance to judges across the state
- Purchase Ipads for virtual jury trials and maintain Zoom Licenses
- 1 FTE for additional remote interpreter
 - Services for OCA's remote interpreters have increased over 85% since 2018 and by 50% since the transition to remote hearings in March 2020 compared to the same period in 2019.
- Cost = \$1,139,125 over biennium



Exceptional Item #3 Domestic Violence and Community Safety

Permanent Domestic Violence Training Attorney

- Provides training and technical assistance on domestic violence and protective orders
- Assistance with reporting to the National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS)
- Position intermittently funded as both part-time and full-time via federal and state funding streams
- Cost =\$204,200 over biennium



Protective Order Registry Update

- SB 325 (86th Legislative Session) known as "Monica's Law"
- Provides access to Protective Order applications and Orders to the justice community
- Provides for limited public viewing of protective orders when protected person has authorized access
- Registry went live across the state on October 15, 2020
- 2,128 orders in the Registry as of 11/5, with 3,025 total entries (Applications and Temporary Ex Parte Orders)
- 2 request to post on public site



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
