

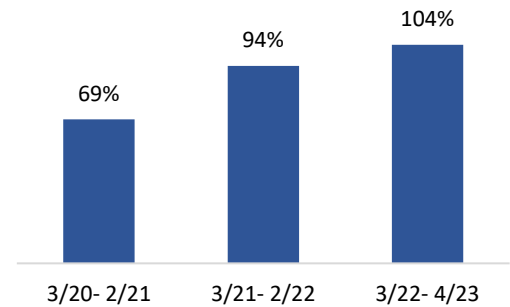
DISTRICT— Data through April 2023



CRIMINAL

- Criminal clearance rates are increasing. Between March 2022 to April 2023, the statewide clearance rate reached 104%.
- Between March 2020 to April 2023, the number of COVID active pending cases was 47,914, 35% less than what was reported during the COVID timeframe (74,056).
- Between March 2022 to April 2023, 90% of the top ten counties with the largest backlogs reported clearance rates above 100%.

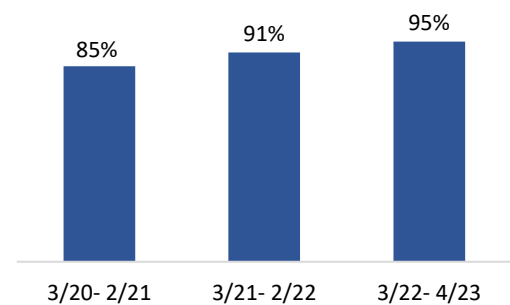
Statewide Clearance Rates



CIVIL

- Civil clearance rates continue to increase. Between March 2022 to April 2023, the statewide clearance rate reached 95%.
- Between March 2020 to April 2023, the number of COVID active pending cases was 65,591, 66% more than what was reported during the COVID timeframe (39,453).
- Between March 2022 to April 2023, 90% of the top ten counties with the largest backlog increased their clearance rates from what was reported from March 2020 to February 2021, while one county remained the same.

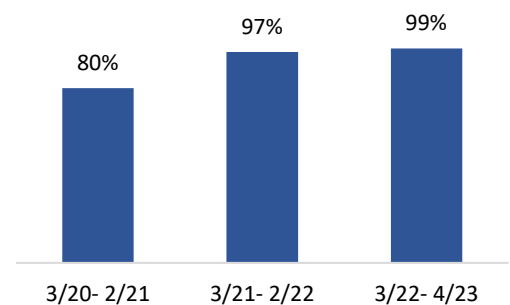
Statewide Clearance Rates



FAMILY

- Family clearance rates continue to increase. Between March 2022 to April 2023, the statewide clearance rate was 99%.
- Between March 2020 to April 2023, the number of COVID active pending cases was 10% less than what was reported during the COVID timeframe (50,088 compared to 55,386).
- Between March 2022 to April 2023, all top ten counties with the largest backlog had higher clearance rates than what was reported during the March 2020 to February 2021 timeframe.

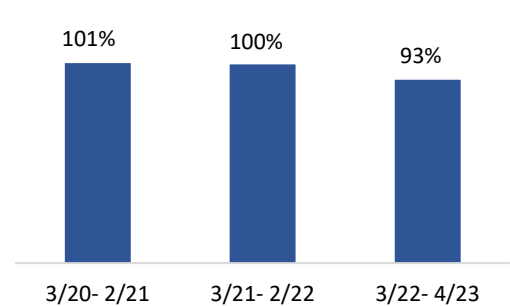
Statewide Clearance Rates



JUVENILE

- Juvenile clearance rates are decreasing. Between March 2022 to April 2023, the statewide clearance rate was 93%, 8% less than what was reported from March 2020 to February 2021.
- Between March 2020 to April 2023, the number of COVID active pending cases was 85% more than what was reported during the COVID timeframe (1,891 compared to 1,023).
- Between March 2022 to April 2023, 40% of the top ten counties with the largest backlog increased their clearance rates from what was reported from March 2021 to February 2022.

Between March 2022 to April 2023, the top 10 counties with the largest backlog made up 20% of the total statewide backlog, 37% less than the percentage of statewide backlog reported from March 2020 to February 2022.

Between March 2022 to April 2023, the top 10 counties with the largest backlog made up 72% of the total statewide backlog, 16% more than the percentage of statewide backlog reported from March 2020 to February 2022.

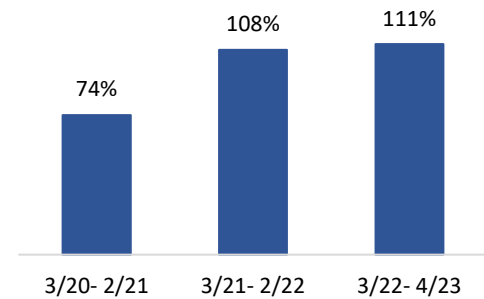

CRIMINAL

- Criminal clearance rates continue to increase. Between March 2022 to April 2023, the clearance rate reached 111%.
- Between March 2020 to April 2023, the number of COVID active pending cases was 36,137, 54% less than what was reported during the COVID timeframe (79,055).
- Between March 2022 to April 2023, 90% of the top ten counties with the largest backlog increased their clearance rates from what was reported from March 2020 to February 2021.

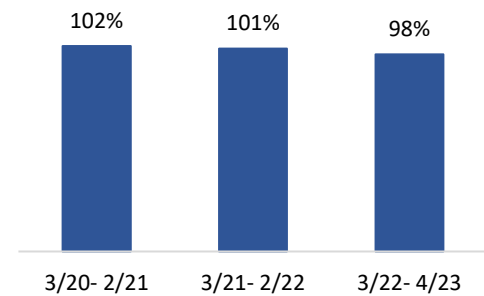
Statewide Clearance Rates



CIVIL

- During the March 2022 to April 2023 timeframe, the statewide civil clearance rate was 98%.
- Between March 2020 to April 2023, the number of COVID active pending cases was 11,690, 49% more than what was reported during the COVID timeframe (7,824).
- Between March 2022 to April 2023, 70% of the top ten counties with the largest backlog increased their clearance rates from what was reported from March 2020 to February 2021.

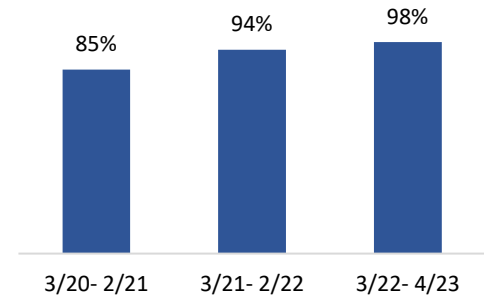
Statewide Clearance Rates



FAMILY

- Family clearance rates continue to increase. Between March 2022 to April 2023, the statewide clearance rate reached 98%.
- Between March 2020 to April 2023, the number of COVID active pending cases was 7,116, 11% more than what was reported during the COVID timeframe (6,428).
- Between March 2022 to April 2023, 60% of the top ten counties with the largest backlog reported clearance rates greater than 100%.

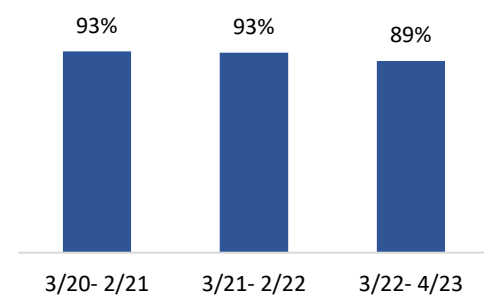
Statewide Clearance Rates



JUVENILE

- Juvenile clearance rates are decreasing. Between March 2022 to April 2023, the statewide clearance rate was 89%.
- Between March 2020 to April 2023, the number of COVID active pending cases was 1,246, 101% more than what was reported during the COVID timeframe (619).
- Between March 2022 to April 2023, 70% of the top ten counties with the largest backlog increased their clearance rates from what was reported from March 2021 to February 2022.
