Fourth Court of Appeals to Hear Oral Argument

The Fourth Court of Appeals will hear oral arguments in two appeals on Wednesday, April 3, 2013, beginning at 9:00 a.m., before the following panel of justices: Justice Karen Angelini, Justice Sandee Bryan Marion, and Justice Patricia O. Alvarez.

The following cases will be presented:

Robert Lane Marsh v. The State of Texas – Robert Lane Marsh, appellant, appeals his conviction for possession of a firearm by a felon after he entered a plea of nolo contendere pursuant to a plea bargain. Prior to his plea entry, appellant filed a motion to suppress his consent to search his property. The trial court denied his motion to suppress. After accepting his plea, the trial court sentenced appellant to eight years in prison and assessed a fine of \$1,500.00. In one issue on appeal, appellant asserts the trial court erred in denying his motion to suppress because his consent to search was invalid and the fruits of the search must therefore be suppressed.

In the Interest of M.G.N. and A.C.N., Minor Children - This appeal arises from the requests of Appellant, George Carl Noyes, and Appellee, Monica Noyes, to modify the conservatorship arrangement in their mediated settlement agreement. The issue of conservatorship was ultimately determined by an eleven-member jury, and the issues of attorney's fees and child support were tried to the bench. George raises four issues on appeal: (1) the trial court deprived George of a fair trial by a 12-person jury of his choice by wrongfully dismissing a seated juror; (2) the judgment modifying the decree is not supported by the pleadings; (3) the trial court erred by excluding relevant evidence concerning the issue of managing conservatorship; and (4) the trial court erred in its award of attorney's fees against George.

The oral arguments will be held in the Fourth Court's Courtroom, Cadena-Reeves Justice Center, Third Floor, 300 Dolorosa, San Antonio, Texas.
