Order on Motion to Determine Vexatious Litigant

On April 16, 2014 a hearing was held, after notice to the Respondent, Kenneth Dowe Jr., to determine whether he is a vexatious litigant.

The Respondent did not appear and after the hall was sounded there was no response. The Court therefore proceeded and after review of the filings by the Respondent the Court found that the Respondent, as the plaintiff has filed numerous and voluminous pleadings pro se in this case. The respondents in the above mentioned litigation involves Kenneth Dowe Sr. and at times, his wife, Dottie Dowe.

This Court proceeding pursuant to Texas Civil Practice & Remedies Code, found that the Respondent is a vexatious litigant after it was shown that there is not a reasonable probability that the plaintiff will prevail in the litigation against the defendant and that after litigation involving his minor son has been finally determined against him. The Respondent, in the custody case of his son, now acting as the plaintiff repeatedly relitigates or attempts to relitigate, in propia persona, either:

- (A) the validity of the determination against the same him as to whom the litigation was finally determined; or
- (B) the cause of action, claim, controversy, or any of the issues of fact or law determined or concluded by the final determination against the same defendant as to whom the litigation was finally determined...

Based on this finding, this Court has determined that the Respondent is a vexatious litigant.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, that the Respondent, Kenneth Dowe Jr., is prohibited from filing, in propria persona, any new litigation in this 256th District Court involving his son until he obtains permission from the local administrative judge pursuant to Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code section 11.102.
