**ORDER DETERMINING PLAINTIFF, SUSAN SCOTT,
TO BE A VEXATIOUS LITIGANT UNDER CHAPTER 11 OF THE
TEXAS CIVIL PRACTICE AND REMEDIES CODE AND SETTING SECURITY**

On this day the Court heard Defendant's Motion for Order Determining Plaintiff a Vexatious Litigant. After consideration of the motion, evidence, and argument of counsel, the Court finds that the motion should be **GRANTED** in all respects. Accordingly, it is


ORDERED that Plaintiff, Susan Scott, is determined by the Court to be a vexatious litigant, as that term is used in Chapter 11 of the Texas Civil Practices and Remedies Code. It is further

ORDERED that on or before 24 February, 2006, Plaintiff shall furnish security in the form of an executed bond in the amount of \$ 5,000.⁰⁰, with two or more good and sufficient sureties to be approved by the Clerk, or cash deposit in such amount in lieu thereof, for the benefit of Judge M. Kent Sims, to assure payment to Judge Sims and the State of Texas of any reasonable expenses incurred in or in connection with this litigation. It is further

ORDERED that, based upon the finding that Susan Scott is a vexatious litigant, Susan Scott is hereby prohibited from filing, in propria persona, any new litigation in a court

in the State of Texas without first obtaining approval to do so from the local administrative judge of the court in which Susan Scott seeks to file the litigation.
